SUBJECT: ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 25.12 OF THE CITY CODE RELATING TO HORSE-DRAWN VEHICLES IN OLD SACRAMENTO

SUMMARY:

This report describes the proposed amendment to Chapter 25.12 of the City Code relating to horse-drawn vehicles, and also describes the procedure used to develop the proposed changes.

The proposed changes are intended to improve humane treatment of animals used to draw vehicles in Old Sacramento, to improve public safety through new training, licensing and procedure requirements for drivers, to improve customer satisfaction, and to enrich the historical character of Old Sacramento.

**SUBJECT: AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 25.12 OF THE CITY CODE
RELATING TO HORSE-DRAWN VEHICLES IN OLD SACRAMENTO**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: 1 (Old Sacramento)

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the item be passed for publication of title and continued to January 27, 1998.

SUMMARY:

This item is presented at this time for approval of publication of title pursuant to City Charter, Section 32.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

At its regularly scheduled meeting on January 6, 1998, the Law and Legislation Committee reviewed and recommended for Council approval, the proposed ordinance changes.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

In response to a number of comments from interested persons, Old Sacramento management organized a series of meetings with stakeholders interested in recommending to Council certain revisions to the horse-drawn vehicle regulations presently part of the City Code.

On April 29, 1997, May 14, 1997 and June 25, 1997 City staff with individuals representing the SPCA, Animal Rights and Animal Watch. Three of the four horsedrawn carriage operators currently providing services in Old Sacramento were also in attendance, having accepted Old Sacramento Management's general invitation to attend the meetings. The concerns of the participants were to increase public safety, to better ensure the humane treatment of the animals, to improve customer satisfaction, and to enrich the historical character of Old Sacramento.

To improve public safety, the meeting participants proposed several ordinance changes, among them, that drivers must: 1) observe a licensed, experienced horsedrawn vehicle operator for 24 hours, 2) undergo 40 hours of hands-on driving experience under the supervision of a licensed, experienced horsedrawn vehicle operator, 3) possess a valid California driver's license issued by D.M.V., 4) pass a proficiency test which includes a written exam covering City rules and regulations, 5) obey all traffic laws, and 6) be free of convictions of cruelty to animals. Vehicles must have tail and side lights, and working brakes. Rules were also proposed regarding the safe conduct of passengers and drivers. To address the hazards to cars and pedestrians posed by overcrowding in Old Sacramento, each operator is limited to having no more than 5 vehicles in operation at any one time.

Some of the changes proposed to better the humane treatment of the dray animals include: 1) establishing minimum weight, age and muscle tone standards for horses; 2) establishing maximum work speed for animals, and maximum atmospheric temperature during which horses may be required to work; 3) establishing rules regarding the use of pregnant or post-partum animals, and 4) requiring company owners to maintain and submit to the City a monthly health and work log for each animal.

To improve customer satisfaction and to enhance the historical character of Old Sacramento, drivers shall be dressed in historically authentic clothing.

It is requested that Council approves by Resolution, the proposed changes to an existing ordinance regulating horse drawn vehicles in Old Sacramento.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

No new fees are proposed and no financial consequences are anticipated as a result of the proposed amendment to the City Code.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Planning Services Division, Environmental Section has reviewed this report and has determined that it has no potential for causing a significant impact on the environment and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The proposed City Code change is consistent with City policy to work with community and business groups to improve the quality and ambiance of Sacramento attractions.



- (c) The director shall impose such conditions upon the permit as may be deemed appropriate to protect the public health, safety and welfare.

- (d) A copy of the operating permit shall be prominently displayed in each vehicle operated pursuant to the permit. (Ord. No. 85-072, §1)

25.12.256 Application for driver's permit and issuance of permit.

- (a) An application for the driver's permit required by this chapter shall be made to the director on forms provided by the city. Such application shall include:
- (1) The name, address and age of the applicant; and
 - (2) A description of the applicant's experience and background driving horse-drawn vehicles.
 - (3) The license number on the applicant's valid, current driver's license or past driver's license.
- (b) An applicant for the driver's permit shall be at least 18 years of age.
- (c) An application shall be accompanied by a non-refundable application fee in an amount to be established by resolution of the city council.
- (d) The director shall cause to be given to each applicant for a driver's permit a proficiency test including a written test, to determine if the applicant has adequate skills, knowledge, and experience handling horse-drawn vehicles and animals to ensure the safety of the animals, the passengers and other users of the streets. The operator for whom the driver will drive may sit in the horse-drawn vehicle during the driving portion of the proficiency test.
- (e) The director shall issue a driver's permit if he finds that the applicant has passed the proficiency and written tests, that issuance of the permit is not contrary to the public health, safety, or welfare, that the applicant's knowledge of the rules of the road has been demonstrated by the applicant's current or past possession of a California driver's license, and that the applicant has not been convicted of a crime involving cruelty to animals.

- (f) A copy of the driver's permit shall be carried upon the person of the driver whenever the driver is driving a vehicle regulated under this chapter.
- (g) Every driver annually shall attend a class relating to animal heat exhaustion and stress of no more than two hours offered by the city at a cost of no more than \$25 per driver. Failure to attend shall be grounds to suspend or revoke the driver's permit.

25.256-1. Driver Training Requirements

Prior to operating a horse-drawn vehicle on his or her own, every new permittee shall undergo training with an experienced driver as follows:

- (a) The experienced or supervising driver shall have scored a minimum of 85% on his or her proficiency test, and shall have possessed a horse-drawn vehicle driver's permit for a minimum of three (3) years.
- (b) Driver trainee shall be required to ride with an experienced driver for a minimum of twenty-four (24) hours to observe the proper handling and driving of a horse-drawn vehicle and the methods of handling emergency situations for unexpected animal behavior.
- (c) The driver trainee shall drive the horse-drawn vehicle under the supervision of an experienced driver for a minimum of forty (40) hours. The supervising driver shall have scored a minimum of 85% on his or her proficiency test, and shall have possessed a horse-drawn vehicle driver's permit for a minimum of three (3) years.
- (d) During the minimum sixty-four (64) hours of training, the horse-drawn vehicle may be available for hire by the general public.

25.12.258 Regulations for operation of horse-drawn vehicles

- (a) Operators, vehicles, and drivers shall comply with the following requirements:
 - (1) Drivers of horse-drawn vehicles shall obey all traffic laws

and regulations of the City of Sacramento and the State of California.

- (2) Each horse-drawn vehicle shall be equipped with:
 - a. Two tail lights, red in color, visible from 1,000 feet when lit and mounted between 15 and 72 inches apart;
 - b. Two side marker lights, amber in color, one on each side of the vehicle, visible from the front; and
 - c. Brakes in good working condition.
- (3) No horse-drawn vehicle shall be left unattended on the public right-of-way at any time. A vehicle is attended when a licensed driver is within ten (10) feet of the horse. When one driver is attending two horse-drawn vehicles, the driver shall be on the ground and both horses shall be tied to a hitching post or other fixed object. No driver shall attend more than two vehicles.
- (4) Horses or other animals used to draw vehicles shall be worked no faster than at a slow trot. When traffic permits, the animal shall be walked.
- (5) A driver shall be in the driver's seat of the horse-drawn vehicle with driving lines in hand before loading and unloading passengers. When the driver is required to assist passengers on and off the vehicle, the horse shall be properly secured to a hitching post or other fixed object.
- (6) No person shall unbridle a horse while the horse is connected to a vehicle.
- (7) No person other than a driver with a valid permit or a driver trainee, and no animal, may sit in the driver seating area of any

vehicle, except with prior written consent from the Director.

- (8) No person shall be permitted to stand on any vehicle while it is in motion. All passengers shall remain seating in the passenger seating area except when embarking or debarking the vehicle.
 - (9) A driver shall not smoke, eat, drink or wear head phones while a vehicle is in motion.
 - (10) Drivers shall be dressed in historically authentic clothing.
 - (11) All carry-on equipment shall be safely secured while the vehicle is in motion.
- (d) Horses and other animals shall be further governed as follows:
- (1) No animal shall work for more than eight hours per day. An animal shall be deemed to be working whenever it is attached to a horse-drawn vehicle. An animal shall be rested and watered for at least 20 minutes after two hours of work and at least 30 minutes after both four hours (total) and six hours (total) of work. When the outdoor temperature exceeds 90 degrees F., the rest shall be provided in a shaded location.
 - (2) No animal shall work when a thermometer, placed at a street level location selected by the Director, registers 100 degrees F., except that when an operator previously entered into an agreement to provide service on such date, an animal may be worked for the previously agreed upon service only. Each operator shall provide to the director, in advance, a monthly listing of all pre-contracted service obligations, including the date, time and length of each service to be provided and the name and telephone number of the patron to whom the service will be provided. Only a service contained in the monthly listing shall qualify for exception from the 100 degrees F. limit.
 - (3) Mares shall not be permitted to work past the seventh month of

pregnancy, and shall not return to work until the fifth month after giving birth.

- (4) No horse under the age of three years shall be permitted to draw a horse-drawn vehicle.
- (e) A health passport/work log shall be kept for each animal used by the operator, containing the following information:
- (1) A color photograph showing front and rear views of the animal.
 - (2) Name of animal, sex, size, weight and breed.
 - (3) Dates of vaccinations, worming and other health care procedures.
 - (4) The dates and hours the animal works.
 - (5) Any other information which the city determines is reasonably necessary to insure proper care of the animal.

One copy of the health passport/work log shall be kept with the animal at all times. Each operator shall provide a copy of the health passport/work log for every animal used in his/her operation to Old Sacramento Management office by the 5th of each month for the previous calendar month.

SECTION 2:

Section 25.04.060 is hereby amended to read as follows:

25.04.060 Animal-Drawn Vehicles

No person shall ride any animal or drive any animal-drawn vehicle into or within the central traffic district between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. or 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. of any day. This prohibition shall not apply in Old Sacramento or to horse-drawn vehicles carrying school groups to and from Old Sacramento and other points of historical or educational interest.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25.12 OF THE SACRAMENTO CITY CODE RELATING TO HORSE- DRAWN VEHICLES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

SECTION 1.

Sections 25.12.251, 25.12.255, 25.12.256, and subsections (a), (d), and (e) of Section 25.12.258 of the Sacramento City Code are hereby amended to read as follows:

25.12.251 Definitions

“Director” shall mean the Director of the Downtown Department or the Director’s designee.

“For Hire” shall mean any use of a horse-drawn vehicle for which any consideration is paid by any person.

“Horse-drawn Vehicle” shall include any wagon, coach, omnibus, or any vehicle which is powered in whole or in part by a horse, mule, or other animal.

“Old Sacramento” shall mean the area bounded on the south by the center line of Capitol Mall and Tower Bridge, on the north by the I Street Bridge, on the east by the westerly right-of-way line of interstate freeway Route 5, and on the west by the centerline of the Sacramento River. (Ord. No. 85-072, §1)

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 25.12 (SECTIONS 25.12.251, 25.12.255, 25.12.256, AND 25.12.258) AND SECTION 25.04.060 OF, AND ADDING SECTION 25.12.256-1 TO, THE SACRAMENTO CITY CODE RELATING TO HORSE-DRAWN VEHICLES

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“Horse-drawn Vehicle” shall include any wagon, coach, omnibus, or any vehicle which is powered in whole or in part by a horse, mule, or other animal.

“Old Sacramento” shall mean the area bounded on the south by the center line of Capitol Mall and Tower Bridge, on the north by the I Street Bridge, on the east by the westerly right-of-way line of interstate freeway Route 5, and on the west by the centerline of the Sacramento River. (Ord. No. 85-072, §1)


