SUMMARY

The United States Olympic Team Trials for Track and Field will be held in Sacramento, July 14-23, 2000. This resolution authorizes the City Manager to execute an agreement between the City and

the in regard to the City's commitment to provide traffic control and protective services associated with the Olympic Trials and the Foundation's commitment to compensate the City up to \$125,000 for those services.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION

BACKGROUND

From July 14 through July 23, 2000, Sacramento will be host to the 2000 Olympic Team Trials for Track and Field at Hornet Stadium at California State University, Sacramento. City staff has been working closely with the Sacramento Sports Commission for over two years to ensure that this will be a premier sporting event. More than 9,500 eight day tickets have been sold for the event which exceeds expectations. The Foundation estimates an average daily attendance of 22,000 spectators viewing events that will bring approximately 800 athletes from around the nation to Sacramento.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

In accordance with the agreement, the City will provide traffic control services and signs, telecommunication consulting, police reserve officers (including overtime), and other services and supplies related to the Olympic Trials. The City's costs for these services are not expected to exceed \$125,000. The Foundation will reimburse the City an amount not to exceed \$125,000 for these services.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Execution of this agreement is consistent with efforts to positively promote the City of Sacramento. Further, it is consistent with the City Council's intent to identify and secure reimbursement for City services as appropriate.


ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE
AN AGREEMENT WITH THE SACRAMENTO REGION SPORTS EDUCATION

WHEREAS, the 2000 United States Olympic Team Trials for Track and Field (hereinafter "Olympic Trials") will be held in Sacramento from July 14, 2000 through July 23, 2000 at Hornet Stadium on the campus of California State University Sacramento.

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento (hereinafter "City") desires to enter into an agreement with the Sacramento Region Sports Education Foundation (hereinafter "Foundation") to compensate the City for costs and services associated with providing traffic control and protective services related to the Olympic Trials.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO that:

1. The City Manager or a designated representative is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the City, an agreement in substantially the form attached, with the Foundation for the City's provision of traffic control and protective services for the Olympic Trials.
2. The revenue budget is amended to include any payment from the Sacramento Sports Education Foundation (101-210-2123-3599).
3. The operating budget will be increased by the above payment (101-210-2123-4110).
