SUBJECT: Community Partnership for Safety Grant: Request to Apply for and Execute Grant Award Agreement and Augment the Grant Operating Budget by \$107,430.

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: Firehouse Community Center, District 2; Stockton Boulevard Neighborhood Resource Center, District 6.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution which authorizes application for and acceptance of grant funds to continue a Community Partnership for Safety program in the Del Paso Heights and Stockton-Fruitridge areas of Sacramento.

SUMMARY:

The Police Department requests approval to apply for and accept from the State Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) a grant to be known as the Community Partnership for Safety program. The total program budget is \$134,288 which will fund the program from July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998 for this third year of a three year program. OCJP will provide funding of \$107,430 and the required 20% cash match will be absorbed within the existing operating budgets of the Police and Neighborhood Services Departments.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Office of Criminal Justice Planning has, for the third time in three years, released a Request for Proposal (RFP) to implement a community based prevention and intervention program. The Police Department and Neighborhood Services Division applied for and received funding from Community Partnership for Safety Grant under the first RFP in July 1995 and the second RFP in July 1996. The Community Partnership for Safety Program was recognized by the Director of OCJP as one of the most successful in California.

The Community Partnership for Safety Program will encourage citizen volunteer participation in cooperative efforts with law enforcement, schools, government and community agencies for the health and safety of neighborhoods. The two resource centers target the areas of Del Paso Heights and Stockton Boulevard. The coordinators will continue to refine community and police prevention programs such as: Neighborhood Watch, Presentations, K.I.N.G.'s (Kids Independent of Narcotics and Gangs), KIDS (Kids Involved in Developmental Skills), home invasion workshops, and senior safety presentations to the low income senior projects adjacent to the resource centers. These programs will encourage more citizen involvement and provide improved services to the community which will promote safer and healthier neighborhoods.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The total program budget for the grant is \$134,288. Total funding of \$107,430 from OCJP is available for a 12 month period from July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998. A 20% cash match of \$26,858 is required, of which 10% will be paid by the Police Department and 10% by Neighborhood Services Division Areas 3 and 4. The match will be funded by the respective operating organizations for FY 97/98.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR CONTINUATION GRANT FUNDING, EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT; AND TO AUGMENT THE GRANT OPERATING BUDGET BY \$107,430

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to implement a certain project designated the Community Partnership for Safety Program to be funded in part from funds made available from the State of California and administered by the Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. The Police and Neighborhood Services Departments are authorized to submit an application for grant funding from OCJP in the amount of \$134,288 for implementation of the third year of a three year program of the Community Partnership for Safety Program.
2. The City Manager, or a designated representative, is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the City of Sacramento the Grant Award Agreement, including any extensions or amendments thereof.
3. The City agrees to provide all matching funds required for said project (including any amendment thereof) under the Program and funding terms and conditions of OCJP. The cash match for FY 97/98 of \$26,858 will be appropriated as required. The funds for this match will be absorbed within the existing operating budgets of the Police and Neighborhood Services Departments.
4. The Grant Revenue Budget will be augmented by \$107,430 (250-OGR-G093-3511 and 250-OGR-G094-3511).
5. The Grant Operating Budget will be augmented as follows:

6. Grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.
7. It is agreed that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the City of Sacramento. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability.
