Dear Mayor Steinberg and City Council Members,

I am grateful for the opportunity to address you this evening. I am a resident in Oak Park, a mother of 10, and a member on the Oak Park Little League Board of Directors.

McClatchy Park, the home of Oak Park Little League, is being monopolized by one man's traveling team, and his attempt to bring Sac High's baseball teams to the only fields that WE have, and he is exploiting neighborhood children to work his agenda.

For six years, I have watched Kirk Crump manipulate our League, and you City employees, as he has tried to monopolize the field that our children have played on since the early 70s. I personally watched as you, Councilman Shenerir, turn a blind eye to Kirk's faux rosters and schedules. I attended all of the scheduled games scheduled by Kirk, and his teams actually played about 4 games on our fields, only one that I witnessed had an actual umpire. These games were played in March and early April, leaving most of April and all of May unavailable for games and practices by our 120 player league, on his "scheduled" days. Not to mention the hours and labor involved in preparing the Snack Shack for his use, when it was only utilized by him less than 5 times!

According to Sacramento city code and our signed contracts, non-use of reserved facilities would necessitate the prohibiting of future contracts to be honored. Yet, though you have been informed of the empty fields on Kirk's reserved days, when our many, many teams needed the fields for practice and games, you have refused to enforce this code and have continued to give precedence to him. As he is a Parks and Rec City employee, this constitutes a great conflict of interests.

Kirk Crump is currently soliciting money for his traveling teams on Facebook's Go Fund Me page that his teams are under the charter of RBI. It also appears on fundraising letterhead that Oak Park Youth Baseball is under the legal umbrella of Cal Ripkin Baseball. NEITHER of these leagues are associated in any manner with Kirk Crump and his organization. He is committing FRAUD! As you are aware the City Attorney, Parks and Recreation Department and Kirk Crump himself have been served Cease and Desist orders over the past two years from RBI, to keep him from illegally representing himself with RBI. In addition, the NorCal Cal Ripkin State Commissioner, Steven Davidson, confirmed to me that Kirk has absolutely no affiliation with Cal Ripkin. I have attached evidence to your letters showing that even today he is still engaging in this illegal behavior. Little League International's legal department has been notified, as well as both Cal Ripkin and RBI administrators. I am forwarding this letter to the Sacramento Police Department with the evidence. I expect this manner to be dealt with by you, our City Council, as YOUR INTEGRITY hangs in the balance, as your OWN employee's fraudulent, behavior towards you, the law AND Little League Baseball continues.

In the midst of this exasperation, our park was plagued by gang activity, illegal drug use, illegal gambling and paint-ball fights in the parking lot, the safety of the children who came out to play ball, as well as us adults, was greatly compromised. Yet, we pressed on, with the help of our Sacramento Police Department.

One might think that we would give up, cut bait, count our losses and fold Oak Park Little League. But I stand here tonight to say that we aren't going anywhere. We are a strong and proud league, and we will fight to make the 2019 season our biggest, most competitive and accomplished season in years!

Two years ago, plans were drawn up to renovate McClatchy Park's baseball and softball diamonds. The plan included batting cages, bull pens, new bleachers, the works. The renovation will begin in November, but would not be finished until mid-March, barring unforeseen postponements, like poor weather. So we will begin our 2019 season, Oak Park's 66th season, with no guarantee of having a field.

Imagine my horror as I learned that the renovated fields will not be made to comply with Little League's field regulations, but will only accommodate only accommodate HIGH SCHOOL level games! I am appalled that despite your vocal and public support of Little League, you are, by your action and inaction, destroying Oak Park Little League. Your own Kirk Crump is vying to use these new fields for his Sac High baseball teams! WHY would YOU allow such abhorrent behavior towards our Oak Park youth? You are now **COMPLICIT IN THE DESTRUCTION OF OAK PARK LITTLE LEAGUE!** WHY, Mayor Steinberg, City Councilman Shenerir, and the rest of the Council, are you actually refusing to support Oak Park Little League, despite your comments to the contrary? WHY will you refuse such a wholesome, family activity to cease to exist, and therefore denying 200 local, underserved children, ages 4 to 14, a place to gather on evenings and weekends to play America's Favorite Pastime? WHY did you remove "Home of Oak Park Little League" from the McClatchy Park signage, while erecting a monument to its founders? If we aren't out there investing in our youth, being sound role models, teaching sportsmanship and integrity to our youth, WHO do you think will step in and influence these children? I think you all know the answer. Please do the right thing by our kids.

The Consent Calendar is considered one item. Speakers may not concede their time to another speaker. The presiding officer may further limit time allotted.

- verbal threats
- banging, slamming or throwing objects
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
