SUBJECT: Amendment to Four-Party Agreement Relating to
Paratransit, Inc. - Supplemental Report

SUMMARY

Since our letter to the Council of November 13, 1981, Sacramento Regional Transit District has approved the amendment to the four-party agreement with the addition of the sentence shown in underline on the attached draft. The County will consider this amendment on December 1, and the City staff recommends approval of the proposed language.

BACKGROUND

The additional sentence does not obligate the City to fund Paratransit for the 1982-83 fiscal year. It does, however, provide that for purposes of the long-range study, the parties assume that total funding by the City and County for transit services in fiscal year 1982-83 will remain at the same level as 1981-82. In addition to the fact that this sentence is not binding upon the City, the apportionment of funds between the City and County could be different during 1982-83.

RECOMMENDATION

Although the addition of the sentence in the proposed amendment is not as favorable as the original amendment proposal, the staff recommends approval of the revised amendment because it does not obligate the City to provide funding at this time for the 1982-83 fiscal year.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE FOUR PARTY
AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE PROVISION OF
TRANSPORTATION SERVICES TO THE ELDERLY AND HANDICAPPED
IN SACRAMENTO COUNTY (FOUR PARTY AGREEMENT)

Section 1: Article I of the Four Party Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

"I Term

This Agreement shall be for a two-year term and shall expire on June 30, 1983."

Section 2: Section VII A. of the Four Party Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

"A. The parties recognize that this initial two year designation of Paratransit, Inc., as a CTSA to provide transportation to the elderly and handicapped may be an interim solution. In order to develop a long range program for the financing of transportation services for the elderly and handicapped and an appropriate division of service and funding levels between fixed route service provided by RT and door to door service provided by Paratransit, Inc., the City, SACOG, County, and RT shall each appoint one board member and one staff person who shall, by May 1, 1982, make a joint recommendation to each of the affected agencies including recommendations for appropriate amendments to this Agreement to cover the 1982-83 year. The foregoing recommendation shall be formulated on the assumption that total funding by the City and County for transit services for fiscal year 1982-1983 will remain at the same level as funding for transit services for fiscal year 1981-1982. Said recommendations shall not be binding on any of the parties."

Section 3: The extension of the term of the Four Party Agreement as provided for in this Amendment shall not in any way be construed to obligate the parties hereto to provide funding beyond that which is now provided for in the Four Party Agreement; that is, beyond June 30, 1982.

SUMMARY

The attached resolution and amendment to the four-party agreement relating to Paratransit amends the agreement in various respects. It does not increase or extend any funding obligation of the City.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The attached amendment to the four-party agreement relating to providing transportation services to the elderly and handicapped amends the four-party agreement relating to Paratransit in the following respects:

1. The agreement is extended from a one-year contract to a two-year contract to expire June 30, 1983.
2. The agreement designates Paratransit, Inc., as a Consolidated Transportation Service Agency for a second year. The amendment also establishes a procedure to develop a long-range program for financing and providing transportation services for the elderly and handicapped. A committee is established to report to the parties by May 1, 1982, on the long-range alternatives.
3. The amendment makes it clear that the funding obligations of the parties are not changed in any way by this amendment. In other words, the City of Sacramento is only obligated to provide funding for the current fiscal year ending June 30, 1982. Funding for the next fiscal year will have to be resolved at a later date.

The Consolidated Transportation Service Agency Committee recommends approval of this amendment. Councilwoman Robie and Assistant City Manager Mailes are members of this committee.

According to Jim Barnes, SACOG Director, the schedule for dealing with the financial and service issues relating to this subject is as follows:

In late November the Joint Task Force of the Paratransit Board and the RT Board will hold its organizational meeting. You recall that the function of this Task Force is to formulate recommendations on: a) The appropriate division of service and funding levels for the transportation of the elderly and handicapped between fixed route service provided by RT and door-to-door service provided by Paratransit, Inc.; and b) a legislative program if deemed necessary to accomplish a).

In December the SACOG staff, the Paratransit staff and the RT staff will initiate studies called for in the Four-Party Agreement.

By March 1, 1982, the report by SACOG will be completed quantifying the difference in service provided by Paratransit, Inc., within the City and the unincorporated area of the County.

By April 1, 1982, the Joint Task Force of the Paratransit Board and the RT Board will present its recommendations.

By May 1, 1982, the Consolidated Transportation Service Agency Committee will consider recommendations from the Task Force and formulate recommendations to the four parties.

RECOMMENDATION

The City staff recommends approval of this agreement.
