**SUBJECT:** Designation of the Sacramento County Health Department as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) for Sacramento City Solid Waste

SUMMARY:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt a resolution designating the County Health Department as the single Local Enforcement Agency for Sacramento City Solid Waste.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, the City of Sacramento has two agencies designated as the Local Enforcement Agency for municipal solid waste. The City Planning Department is designated as the City's LEA for those activities identified as non-health items in the California Administrative Code. The County Health Department is designated as the City's LEA for all health items.

City staff desires to solidify the current LEA activities such that a single agency, the County Health Department, is the LEA for the City.

All parties, the City, the Waste Management Board, and the County are in agreement with this re-designation. The County Board of Supervisors are to approve this change at their January 22, 1985 meeting.

FINANCIAL:

The designation of the County Health Department as the City's sole LEA will require the Solid Waste Division to expend an additional \$1,203 in fiscal year 1984-85. The added \$1,203 can be absorbed in the existing Solid Waste Division budget.

The added cost is related to a new California Waste Management Board requirement that the City's landfill be inspected each week as opposed to the previous requirement of once each month.
