## RESOLUTION No. 70

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

JULY 19, 1928.

WHEREAS, it is reported arrangements have been made to move the bureau of fish culture of the California Fish and Game Commission to San Francisco, and

WHEREAS, the Executive Officer of said Commission is quoted as saying that other officers and employees of said Commission would be transferred to San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Sacramento is the capital city of California and as such is the seat of government of this state, and

WHEREAS, Sacramento is the city most conveniently located to the major wild fowl marshes, the largest forest reserves and upland game refuges and the most important rivers, streams and mountain lakes of California, and is the ideal location for the fish and game Commission's principal officers, bureaus and employees;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sacramento City Council hereby most vigorously protests the removal of any of the bureaus, departments or officials of the California Fish and Game Commission to San Francisco and it respectfully requests the Honorable C. C. Young, Governor of the State of California and Fred G. Stevenot, Director of Natural Resources to investigate the necessity for the proposed removal.

BE IT HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Council representing the People of the City of Sacramento also positively objects to any action on the part of the State to remove any other Department which logically belongs at the Capital City of the State.
