It has come to my attention that there is some concern within the community as to the nature of the project review comments I submitted to Current Planning staff on April 1, 2001, regarding the Preliminary Review application for the Islands at Riverlake project, file number IR01-024. I am writing this memorandum to clarify the intent of the comments and the long standing practice within the Development Services Department of Long Range Planning staff commenting on Current Planning development projects.

It is customary for development applications to be routed to Long Range Planning staff and for that staff to provide constructive comments to the Project Manager. Long Range staff comments primarily on applications that involve infill housing, projects in transit areas, or projects located in areas where they might be affected by a Long Range project.

There is one member of the Long Range staff at a time that is assigned the job duty of typing up the team's comments and delivering them to the Project Manager. At the time the Islands at Riverlake Preliminary Review application came in, I was the planner assigned to this task. I had no other involvement with the project other than to summarize the twenty minute conversation that took place at Long Range's regular staff meeting when this project was reviewed and deliver them to the Project Manager.

I have had no involvement with the project since that time, and have not reviewed, nor been asked to review, the formal submittal for planning entitlements (the P# file) or any subsequent revisions to the proposed project that may have addressed the Long Range comments.

**Subject: Islands at Riverlake- The Pocket Protectors Appeal Letter**

Dear Lezley:

The purpose of this letter is to clarify the Development Engineering's position regarding traffic issues associated with the Islands at Riverlake project.

During the City's review of the Islands at Riverlake project's traffic impacts, Dev. Engineering and Finance determined that the project land use designation is less intense than the land use designation for the site in the Pocket Area Community Plan and that the traffic that will be generated from the Islands at Riverlake project will be within, and not exceed, the capacity of Pocket Road; therefore, the proposed project and its ingress and egress points will not cause any significant impact along Pocket Road not evaluated in the community plan EIR.

Dev. Engineering determined in the Initial Study prepared for the project that the predicted Level of Service (LOS) with the full build out of the project would not meet the City's threshold criteria for significant traffic impacts. Caltrans asked in their comment letter on the Notice of Preparation for the EIR that the City evaluates the traffic situation anyway, which the City did and included in the City's Final EIR. The traffic study confirmed the City's conclusion that there would not be any significant impacts related to traffic associated with the project and no new findings of impacts in the traffic study require the need to re-circulate the DEIR.

Additionally, I would like to respond, on behalf of the Development Engineering and Finance Department, to the Pocket Protector's January 9, 2006, appeal letter on the project. At page 2, paragraph 5, of the Pocket Protector's appeal, the letter states that "Eastham [of Caltrans] indicated that she did not agree with the conclusions drawn in the EIR regarding the insignificance of traffic impacts for the project because the study did not evaluate (1) growth projected to occur in Elk Grove; (2) the new interchange and over crossing on I-5; and (3) 9,000 homes planned for the Pocket area."



The City's responses to these concerns are as follows:

1. On page 14 of the traffic study, under Year 2025 Conditions, it is stated that: "*The SACMET travel demand-forecasting model (V, 01) that was previously modified for the Cosumnes River Boulevard/I-5 interchange Project Study Report traffic study was used to develop traffic volume forecasts for Year 2025 conditions.*" Therefore, any estimated growth in the Elk Grove area and the interchange project is already accounted for in the SACMET Model, which was used as the basis for the traffic study for the Islands at Riverlake project. Additionally, the Project Study Report (PSR) for the Cosumnes River Boulevard/I-5 Interchange is a Caltrans document, and Fehr and Peers, who prepared the traffic study for the Islands at Riverlake project, is also the traffic consultant who prepared the traffic study for the interchange program.
2. On page 14 of the traffic study, under the Baseline Conditions, it is stated that two other approved projects were assumed in the Pocket Area:
  - Sycamore Terrace Apartments, a 244-unit apartment complex, and
  - Greenhaven Retail Building, a 12,021-square-foot retail project.

Caltrans, according to the appeal, did not specify the name of the project that has 9,000 units. Delta Shores is the only project that may be close to this size, and Delta Shores was also incorporated in the SACMET interchange model.

3. For the Year 2025 conditions, the traffic study used the SACMET model, which assumed the build out of the City according to the City of Sacramento General Plan and Pocket area Community Plan projections. The traffic study evaluated the impacts of the project on all transportation facilities within the study area. Additionally, as noted above, the model used in the Islands at Riverlake traffic analysis is the updated SACMET model used in the interchange traffic analysis.

It is my understanding, based on the scope of Caltrans' original request for a traffic study and follow-up communications with Ms. Eastham, Chief, Office of Transportation Planning –Southwest and East Caltrans—District 3, that all of Caltrans' concerns have been addressed. Additionally, on January 12, 2006, I sent Ms. Eastham an email asking her for any additional comments and concerns regarding the project. She replied that Caltrans initially had concerns regarding the draft EIR, but that "the review of the traffic study revealed that the mainline future Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) may be less than what Caltrans staff anticipates; however, this would lead to the project having less impact to the cumulative mainline than stated in the traffic study. Caltrans has no further comment on the project at this time." (See attached email exchange between myself and Katherine Eastham.) It is the City's position, therefore, as supported by the Initial Study, traffic study, Draft EIR, and Caltrans, that the Islands at Riverlake will not cause any significant adverse effects on traffic.

Caltrans initially had concerns regarding the draft EIR as the Traffic study was not included in the circulation and in fact was not completed until after the final date for comments. The review of the traffic study revealed that the mainline future AADT may be less than what Caltrans staff anticipates; however, this would lead to the project having less impact to the cumulative mainline than stated in the traffic study.

We also, received a letter of appeal from the Pocket Protectors and in the packet they included a letter from Rachel Howlett, Brandt-Hawley Law Group, addressed to you and dated November 15, 2005. Howlett in her letter indicated that she understood the you have several concerns on the traffic study.
