Summary:

The Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG) will provide an update on the development of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) 2030 for the six county region.

Committee/Commission Action: None.

Background Information:

The MTP is a long-range comprehensive plan for the region's multimodal transportation system that has to be updated every three years in order for this region to receive federal and/or state transportation dollars. The MTP with the horizon year of 2030 will be based on the Blueprint land use allocations.

The preferred Blueprint land use scenario adopted by the SACOG Board in December 2004 reflects a way for the region to grow through the year 2050 in a manner consistent with the growth principles developed through an extensive three-year visioning process. This is an informational report and no Council action is being requested.
