RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Neighborhoods, Planning, and Development Services Department to apply for grant funds from the State of California, Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) - Title V Delinquency Prevention Program.

SUMMARY

The Neighborhoods, Planning and Development Services Department requests approval to apply for funding from the Office of Criminal Justice Planning to implement a comprehensive juvenile delinquency program. The grant amount from OCJP would be \$250,000. There would be an in-kind or cash match of approximately \$50,000 required by the City that will be absorbed within the existing budget.

BACKGROUND

In July 1995, Sacramento County was awarded a grant of \$1.5 million allocated over three years to implement of a comprehensive juvenile delinquency prevention program from OCJP. The program, *The Community That Cares*, is in its final year and provides services to high risk youth from birth to eighteen years of age in the North Sacramento and Del Paso Heights communities. Sacramento County serves as the fiscal agent for the grant and the City acts as the managing agent.

The program provided after-school homework and recreational activities to approximately 2,200 elementary school-age children; and counseling and supportive services were provided to over 200 families, parents and children. The youth involved in the program have seen statistically significant outcomes in academic achievement. Also, contact and involvement with the juvenile justice and child protective services systems have been reduced.

Staff is requesting Council approval to apply for a \$250,000 grant from OCJP to extend the juvenile delinquency prevention strategy to the Meadowview and Lemon Hill/Oak Park communities. This will expand the provision of these services to residents in the southern region of the City. OCJP will award five to six grants statewide. A minimum of two grants will be awarded to cities with populations greater than 250,000. If awarded the grant, the City would be both the fiscal and management agent.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Staff is requesting to apply for a grant from OCJP in the amount of \$250,000. A cash or in-kind match of approximately \$50,000 would be required by the City. The Neighborhoods, Planning, and Development Services Department is working with other agencies including the Sacramento Employment and Training Agency to provide the matching amount . If awarded the grant, staff will return to Council for approval to amend the Department's grant and operating budgets as appropriate.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Approval to apply for grant funds is consistent with past practices. Acceptance of these funds will provide the expansion of this very successful program by the Neighborhoods, Planning, and Development Services Department into other areas of the City.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

This program is exempt from the CEQA requirements because it has been determined that the program has no potential for causing a significant effect on the environment [Section 15061(b)(3)].

MBE/WBE EFFORTS

Materials and services will be procured in accordance with this City's MBE/WBE policy.
