Description/Analysis

Issue Detail: There are folding chairs located at the Memorial Auditorium that are no longer serviceable for events at the Memorial Auditorium, and it is recommended to dispose of these chairs. The Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church is willing to accept these chairs.

Staff recommends the following chairs be donated to the Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church:

- 1,200 – blue folding chairs

Policy Considerations: City Code Chapter 3.80.030 (F) provides that surplus personal property may be donated to any charitable organization exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code by Resolution of the City Council. The Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church is a 501(c)(3) organization.

Economic Impacts: Not applicable.

Environmental Considerations: Under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), continuing administrative activities, such as what is recommended in this report, does not constitute a “project”. [CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(2).]

Sustainability: Not applicable.

Commission/Committee Action: None.

Rationale for Recommendation: Originally purchased in the early 1970s, the folding chairs are worn and in need of replacement. While they are still useful to some organizations, they are no longer serviceable for events held by the City. The chairs have little to no market value, trying to sell them is not feasible. The City has purchased replacement chairs and will incur a disposal cost if the chairs are not donated.

The City reached out to the Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church to see if they had a need for these chairs, since they had previously contacted City personnel inquiring if there was any equipment that was no longer needed and that can be donated to them. The Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church will accept these chairs and help distribute them to a variety of charitable organizations, such as orphanages, women shelter(s), etc.

Financial Considerations: There are no costs to the City for the approval of this Resolution. If the Resolution is not approved, there will be a cost to the City of over \$1,000 to dispose of these chairs.

Local Business Enterprise (LBE): No good or services are being purchased.

APPROVAL TO DONATE 1,200 FOLDING CHAIRS FROM THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO TO THE SLAVIC PENTECOSTAL MISSIONARY CHURCH

BACKGROUND

- A. There are 1,200 folding chairs located at the Memorial Auditorium that are no longer serviceable for events at the Memorial Auditorium and are considered surplus to the City's needs.
- B. Originally purchased in the early 1970's, the folding chairs are worn and in need of replacement. While they are still useful to some organizations, they are no longer serviceable for events held by the City.
- C. The chairs have little to no market value, trying to sell them is not feasible.
- D. The City purchased replacement chairs and will incur a disposal cost if the chairs are not donated.
- E. Staff is requesting City Council approval to donate the 1,200 folding chairs to the Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church.
- F. The Slavic Pentecostal Church will accept these chairs and help distribute them to a variety of charitable organizations, such as orphanages, women shelter(s), etc.
- G. City Code Chapter 3.80.030 (F) provides that surplus personal property may be donated to a 501(c)(3) organization by Resolution of the City Council, and the Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church is a 501(c)(3) organization.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The donation of the 1,200 blue folding chairs to the Slavic Pentecostal Missionary Church is approved.
