**SUBJECT: 1984 City Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program
and 1984 Jobs Bill Program Grantee Performance Reports -
Public Hearings**

SUMMARY

The attached resolution authorizes the Acting Executive Director to submit to HUD the 1984 Grantee Performance Reports for the Community Development Block Grant Program and the Jobs Bill Program. The Commission and City Council should open public hearings and receive public testimony on this item per HUD regulations. A copy of the Grantee Performance Report is on file with the Clerk.

BACKGROUND

Each year the Department of Housing and Urban Development requires recipients of CDBG and Jobs Bill funds to submit Grantee Performance Reports (GPR's) which basically outline the progress and performance of these programs for the preceding funding cycle.

The areas addressed in the GPR include: (1) Activity Summary; (2) Status of Funds (Parts I through III); (3) Direct Benefit Activities; (4) Actions to Affirmatively Further Fair Housing; and (5) Displacement. There is also a narrative explaining the relationship of the use of CDBG funds to the community development objectives outlined in the CDBG application.

In 1984, over \$1.0 million in Jobs Bill funds were spent and \$5.0 million in CDBG funds. A number of significant capital improvement projects were completed in 1984 including: resurfacing of Stockton, 14th, Marysville, Norwood and Northgate Boulevards; reconstruction of Grand Avenue (Jobs Bill); completion of full street improvements in East Del Paso Project Areas 1A and 2; Grand Avenue Streetlighting; Washington Streetlights; Wright and Kimbrough Streetlights; Williamland School Streetlights; the Meadowview Fence Project and Stanford Settlement Remodeling.
