

Emergency Operations Plan: Major Changes

- Format
- Compliance with the National Incident Response Plan
- Addition of a Terrorism Contingency Plan

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New Format

- New guidance replaces Multi-Hazard Functional Planning Guidance
 1. State of California Emergency Planning Guidance for Local Government
 2. Federal National Incident Management System (NIMS)
- Reflects a more operational, multi-agency approach with the focus on procedures and information management.

New EOP is in Compliance with the National Incident Response System (NIMS)

- NIMS provides a consistent nationwide template for domestic incident preparedness, response and recovery.
- Based on California's Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the Incident Command System (ICS)
- Adoption of NIMS is required for Federal Preparedness Assistance funding

Newly Developed Terrorism Contingency Plan

- Integrates the findings of the State Homeland Security Assessment Program (SHSAP)
- Follows FEMA, Office of Domestic Preparedness and State OES guidance
- Supports the City's Emergency Operations Plan (EOP)
- Identifies specific terrorism related responsibilities and procedures
- Establishes a common response protocol
- Outlines a unified strategic plan for all responders
