SUBJECT: AUTHORIZATION TO APPLY TO THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF
CONSERVATION FOR A BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING GRANT

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution authorizing
submittal of a grant application to the Department of Conservation for a beverage container
recycling grant to promote beverage container recycling at City golf courses and parks.

SUMMARY:

A grant application will be submitted to the Department of Conservation on April 3, 2000. The
proposed grant project will allow the City of Sacramento to promote beverage container
recycling through placement of outdoor recycling containers at City golf courses and parks.
This report recommends City Council approval of the resolution authorizing submittal of the
grant application and execution of a standard agreement with the State.

Authorization to Apply to the California Department of Conservation for a Beverage Container Recycling Grant
February 24, 2000

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Solid Waste Division currently recycles beverage containers through the City's curbside recycling program and through programs utilizing outdoor containers located at the City Marina and some City parks. Receipt of additional grant funding will allow the Solid Waste Division to expand the number of outdoor recycling containers in use at City facilities by including sports facilities located at City golf courses and parks. Grant funding will be used to purchase additional outdoor recycling containers. The collection of those containers will be incorporated into existing Solid Waste Division commercial recycling routes.

The attached resolution names the Solid Waste Manager and Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representatives. This action is necessary because an authorized representative is the only person whose signature will be recognized by the Department of Conservation. Utilizing the Solid Waste Manager and the Solid Waste Planning Superintendent as the City's authorized representative will greatly facilitate administration of the grant. They are the City staff who will work with the Department of Conservation on a routine basis as the author of periodic billings, monthly progress reports, etc.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Grant funding will reimburse the City for the purchase of outdoor recycling containers. Solid Waste staff plans to purchase up to twenty-five containers for use in this project. Grant funding will not exceed \$30,000 for the containers. The operational cost for transportation and collection will be borne by the Solid Waste Division as part of matching funds encumbered through the grant. The Solid Waste Division already incurs the cost of waste disposal at these facilities and recycling may decrease the cost of that service.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The grant project is not a project under CEQA. There is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. Therefore, this item is exempt from CEQA guidelines under § 1561(b)(3).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The promotion of beverage container recycling utilizing outdoor containers is consistent with City of Sacramento waste diversion programs and goals. The utilization of grant funding for outdoor containers is consistent with Council policy to provide cost-effective recycling services.



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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A GRANT APPLICATION
TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION FOR A
BEVERAGE CONTAINER RECYCLING GRANT**

WHEREAS, grant funds are available from the Department of Conservation for a beverage container recycling grant; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento has sufficient resources to conduct a beverage container recycling program at City sports facilities; and,

WHEREAS, a beverage container recycling program at sports facilities is consistent with the City Council waste diversion policies and goals;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

1. The City Council hereby authorizes the submittal of a grant application to the Department of Conservation for a beverage container recycling program at City sports facilities.
2. The Solid Waste Manager and Solid Waste Planning Superintendent of the City of Sacramento are hereby authorized and empowered to execute in the name of the City of Sacramento, all necessary applications, contracts, agreements, amendments, payment requests, progress reports and final reports for the purpose of securing said grant funds and to implement and carry out the purposes specified in the grant application.
