SUBJECT: REQUEST TO APPLY FOR AND ACCEPT CONTINUATION GRANT FUNDING FROM THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING FOR THE CRANK ROCK IMPACT PROJECT-SACRAMENTO

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: City-wide

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the Police Department to apply for and accept grant funding from the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) to continue the Crank Rock Impact Project - Sacramento (CRIPS) for a three year period. No cash match is required by the City.

SUMMARY:

The Police Department was awarded grant funding for the twelfth year in the amount of \$1,216,063 for the CRIPS grant from the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP). The grant includes a comprehensive, multi-component approach to combating the sale of methamphetamine and rock cocaine by mid-level and major drug dealers. All grant funds expended for the project will be reimbursed by OCJP to the City of Sacramento where the funds will be managed by the City on behalf of the Police Department and the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office. No cash match is required by the City.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION: None.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program established by OCJP is funded by a federal block grant pursuant to repeated amendments to the Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 and most recently in 1994 under the Crime Act. This program was established to aid state and local criminal justice agencies by improving their ability to combat illegal drugs and drug related crimes of violence. The theme of the ADA Program is enhanced collaboration and coordination between criminal justice agencies at the local, state, and federal levels.

Funding is allocated annually by county using a base rate and the crime index. The Fiscal Year 1999/2000 funding allocation for Sacramento County is \$1,216,063. The City is the primary grantee with the Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office each acting in a sub-grantee role. The total award will be received and administered by the City of Sacramento for reimbursement of grant-related expenses for the Police Department, Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office.

The current grant program has concentrated on mid-level and major drug dealers of methamphetamine and rock cocaine. Because of this highly successful program, significant inroads have been made against Sacramento's drug offenders and dealers. It is anticipated that the program will continue aggressive pursuit of gang-related narcotics traffickers who victimize our citizens by restricting free access to our streets which contributes to the deterioration of our neighborhoods.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Funding is allocated annually by OCJP for the Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program. The allocation to continue the CRIPS grant through June 30, 2000 is \$1,216,063. The Police Department's share is \$526,388 which will continue to fund one sergeant and three officer positions.

Authority to increase the Police Department's Grant Operating Budget by \$1,216,063 will be included in the City's Fiscal Year 1999/2000 Approved Budget. The funding will cover salary, benefits, training and operating costs for the Police Department, Sacramento County Sheriff's Department, Probation Department and District Attorney's Office. The Police Department will need to reapply for funding in Fiscal Year 2000/2001 and 2001/2002. No cash match is required by the City.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The proposed action does not constitute a project under CEQA per Guidelines Section 15061 (b)(1), 15378 (b)(3).


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR AND ACCEPTANCE OF
CONTINUATION FUNDING FROM THE OFFICE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE PLANNING
FOR THE CRANK ROCK IMPACT PROJECT-SACRAMENTO GRANT**

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to undertake a certain project designated the Crank Rock Impact Project-Sacramento to be funded in part from funds made available through the Crime Act of 1994 for the Federal Anti-Drug Abuse Enforcement Program administered by the State of California's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (hereafter referred to as OCJP).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Manager of the City of Sacramento, or a designated representative, is hereby authorized on its behalf to submit a grant proposal to OCJP and is authorized to sign and approve on behalf of the City Council the Grant Award Agreement including any extensions or amendments thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution covers grant agreements for the period from July 1, 1999 through June 30, 2002 including any extensions or amendments thereof.

IT IS AGREED that any liability arising out of the performance of this Grant Award Agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the City of Sacramento and the County of Sacramento. The State of California and OCJP disclaim responsibility for any such liability.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body.

IT IS ALSO AGREED that this award is not subject to local hiring freezes.
