

SPECIAL MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
OCTOBER 12, 1961

The Honorable City Council met in Special Session on this date at hour of 4:15 o'clock P.M., Mayor McKinney presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

Councilmen Domich, Lobner, McKinney, Mering, Nielsen, Seymour and Talkin.

ABSENT: Councilmen Marriott and Shelby.

Executed copies of the Call of the meeting issued by the Mayor and presented by the City Clerk were ordered filed. The Call stated the purpose of the meeting to be that of reviewing the City's current Annexation Policy and to present such other matters as may regularly come before said body or be presented by the City Manager.

Councilman Lobner, at the request of the Mayor, addressed the Council relative to the City's Annexation Policy and suggested that the formation of "Sacramento Citizens Annexation Committee" to promote and to encourage annexations to the City, and reviewed the suggested structure, scope, powers and duties of such committee.

Councilman Marriott arrived.

Planning Director Richard L. Rathfon, addressed the Council, reviewing the extent of annexations to the City, stating that in 1950, the total area of the City was 17 square miles and has, as of this date, increased to a total of 67 square miles. The Planning Director further advised the Council that he and the planning staff were very interested in the suggested Citizens Annexation Committee.

Mr. Tom Evans, Public Information Officer of the City, advised the Council of his activities in the promotion of annexation.

Councilman Shelby arrived.

Mr. Carl Richie, 4726 South Land Park Drive, appeared and urged a speedup of annexation procedures, and further addressed the Council at length on the matter of annexation and population growth. Mr. Richie filed "Population Charts" comparing the growth of Central California Cities for the period 1940 to 1960.

After a thorough discussion on the matter, the Council Annexation Committee was instructed to re-evaluate the City's annexation policy as adopted in 1958 and report back to the Council recommendations for updating same.

At the request of Councilman Talkin, Mr. George Vincent of the Planning Commission staff, advised the Council of staff coordination of annexation proceedings and assistance given to proponents of annexation areas.

Mr. Jim Cronkite, of Foothill Farms, appeared and addressed the Council relative to the Foothill Farms Area becoming annexed to the City of Sacramento.

Mr. John E. Mogan, President of the Taxpayers Council of Hagginwood, Del Paso Heights and Robla, addressed the Council concerning technicalities of the Arden Way Annexation which have held up annexation proceedings of the Hagginwood Area and in closing, filed a copy of a bulletin his organization is distributing in the Hagginwood Area.

After further Council discussion, Councilman Nielsen moved that creation of the "Sacramento Citizens Annexation Committee" be approved and that the Council Annexation Committee be instructed to work out details as to the scope, power and duties of such committee, reporting determination back to the Council. Seconded by Councilman Domich and carried by the following vote:
