

RESOLUTION NO. 308

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of
October 5, 1945.

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE HOLDING OF THE REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 1945, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 185 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING NINE MEMBERS OF THE CITY COUNCIL; ESTABLISHING ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES FOR SAID REGULAR ELECTION AND APPOINTING BOARDS OF ELECTION THEREFOR, AND CONSOLIDATING WITH SAID REGULAR MUNICIPAL ELECTION THE SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED BY RESOLUTION NO. 294 TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON NOVEMBER 6, 1945 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING PROPOSALS FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO.

WHEREAS, the Charter of the City of Sacramento requires that a Regular Municipal Election be held in said City on Tuesday, November 6, 1945; and

WHEREAS, it is advisable that provision be made for the conduct and holding of said election,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, as follows:

1. - That a regular municipal election in and for the City of Sacramento shall be held on Tuesday, November 6, 1945, for the object and purpose of electing nine (9) members of the City Council for the term of two (2) years beginning January 1, 1948, and until their successors are elected and qualified.

2. - That for the purpose of said regular election, the City of Sacramento is hereby divided into one hundred twenty-five (125) election precincts, to be numbered 1 to 125, inclusive. That each of said precincts shall consist of a regular election precinct or a consolidation of two or more general election precincts as now established of record for general state and county election purposes by orders of the Board of Supervisors of Sacramento County, and now on file in the office of the County Clerk of said County of Sacramento; and the boundaries of all municipal election precincts shall consist of the boundaries as designated and described for said general election precincts by orders of the Board of Supervisors of Sacramento County fixing and determining the boundaries of such general election precincts for general state and county election purposes, as the same are now on file and of record in the office of the County Clerk of said Sacramento County. That the boundaries of all consolidated municipal election precincts hereby consolidated for the purposes of said regular municipal election. That said municipal election precincts, the polling places thereat and the officers of election thereat shall be, and the same are hereby, designated as more particularly set forth in the Form of Notice thereof provided in Section 3 of this resolution.

3. - That the City Clerk be, and he is hereby, instructed to publish the list of precincts, polling places and election officers hereby established for the conduct of said regular election, in the official newspaper of the City of Sacramento for at least one (1) issue thereof, at least fifteen (15) days prior to date of said regular municipal election. Such notice may be substantially in the following form:

The following is a list of the election officers appointed and the polling places designated and the election precincts fixed and established by the City Council of the City of Sacramento for the regular municipal election to be held in the City of Sacramento on Tuesday, November 6, 1945:

4. - That the polls at the polling places hereinbefore designated shall open at six o'clock A.M. of the day of said election and close at seven o'clock P.M. of the same day; provided, however, that if at the hour of closing there are any other voters at the polling places or in line at the door, who are qualified to vote and have not been able to do so since appearing, the polls shall be kept open a sufficient time to enable them to vote, but no person who shall arrive at the polling place after the time provided for closing the polls shall be entitled to vote although the polls may be open when he arrives.

5. - That the City Clerk is hereby directed to arrange for the necessary voting booths at the polling places hereinbefore specified and to have the necessary ballots printed and to procure suitable ballot boxes and all necessary supplies and materials for conducting said election. That the City Clerk shall cause to be printed sample ballots identical with the ballots to be used at the election, except as to quality and color of paper, and shall mail a copy of the same to each registered voter at least five (5) days before said election.

6. - That all electors of the City of Sacramento qualified in accordance with the provisions of the City Charter and the general laws of the State of California, shall be entitled to vote at said regular municipal election for the candidates to be elected at said regular municipal election. That the City Council shall meet on Tuesday, the 13th day of November, 1945, at the City Hall, at eight o'clock P.M. and acting as the City Board of Canvassers, shall canvass the result of said election.

7. - That said regular municipal election to be held in said City of Sacramento is hereby consolidated with the special election to be held in said City on said 6th day of November, 1945 for the purpose of submitting certain proposals for the amendment of the Charter of the City of Sacramento, in accordance with and as provided by Resolution No. 294 passed and adopted by the City Council of the City of Sacramento on October 1, 1945, and at said special election to be held for the purpose of submitting said Charter amendments on said day, the precincts, polling places and officers of election shall be the same as those herein set forth for the conduct of said regular election and only one ballot need be used thereat.

8. - That said regular election hereby called shall be held and conducted, and the votes thereat received and canvassed, and the returns thereof made and the result thereof ascertained and determined in accordance with the Charter of the City of Sacramento, and in all particulars not prescribed by said Charter said election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution and general election

laws of the State of California. That this resolution shall be deemed supplementary to the provisions of the Charter of said City of Sacramento and the general election laws of the State of California, and the provisions hereof shall be applicable only in so far as the same shall not be in conflict with the provisions of said Charter or the general laws. That no informalities in conducting said regular municipal election or any election consolidated therewith shall invalidate the same if they have been conducted fairly and in substantial conformity to the requirements of the Charter of the City of Sacramento and the general laws.

9. - This resolution shall take effect immediately.
