SUMMARY

Some smaller housing authorities and redevelopment agencies have expressed interest in retaining the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency to provide occasional technical services that are not easily obtained by them elsewhere. The Agency is willing to provide limited services to the extent that they can be accomplished without impacting the normal activities of the Agency and so long as the Agency is fully reimbursed.

COMMISSION ACTION

It is anticipated that at its meeting of May 3, 2000, the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Commission will adopt a motion recommending approval of the attached resolutions. In the event they fail to do so, you will be advised prior to your May 16, 2000 meeting.

BACKGROUND ...

In the past, some small housing authorities and redevelopment agencies have expressed an interest in retaining the Sacramento Housing and Redevelopment Agency to provide occasional technical services. The Agency currently provides some technical services to the City of Citrus Heights and the City of Folsom related to redevelopment and Community Development Block Grant activities.

Most recently, the Plumas County Development Commission asked if the Agency could provide occasional advisory services to its housing authority. With only about 100 units of conventional and Section 8 housing, they were finding it difficult to obtain such services, and when the services were available to them, the cost was prohibitive. From discussions with their staff, it is that the services requested would require only insubstantial Agency resources. On the other hand the benefit to the Plumas housing authority would be significant.

The Agency would benefit from such arrangements in several respects. All parties then benefit, to some extent, from the economies of scale that resource sharing provides. The arrangement would, of course, provide additional income to the Agency and give the Agency an opportunity to spread its overhead to these income sources. The Agency will also recognize some intangible benefits. The Agency will have the opportunity to build ties with other agencies resulting in better regional cooperation. The Agency will also benefit from idea and information sharing. Perhaps most important, the Agency could use the opportunities to increases its stature, credibility and importance throughout the state.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The recommended action in this report has no financial impact.
