BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:


1. That the Agreement attached as Exhibit A between the City and the County of Sacramento regarding hazardous waste mutual aid is hereby approved.
2. That the 1982-83 Fire Department Budget (1-01-1960-xxxx-xxxx) is increased by \$112,500 as follows:

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE TEAM SPECIAL
MUTUAL AID JOINT POWERS AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, dated for convenience December 14, 1982, is made and entered into by and between the CITY OF SACRAMENTO, a municipal corporation of the State of California (hereinafter called "CITY"), the COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO, a political subdivision of the State of California (hereinafter called "COUNTY"), and those fire protection agencies of Sacramento County (hereinafter called "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS"), signatory hereto.

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, the State of California Hazardous Materials Incident Contingency Plan, which was officially approved by the Governor's Emergency Council on September 15, 1982, pursuant to the provisions of the California Emergency Services Act (Government Code, Chapter 7 of Division 1 of Title 2, Section 8550, et seq.), sets forth and defines the roles and responsibilities of various local, state and federal agencies in responding to potential hazardous material emergency incidents; and

WHEREAS, this agreement is entered into pursuant to the provisions of Title I, Division 7, Chapter 5, Article 1 (Section 6500 et seq.) of the Government Code relating to joint exercise of powers; and

WHEREAS, the proper management and control of responses to emergency incidents involving hazardous materials requires highly specialized training, equipment, supplies, communications and

other resources in order to provide adequate protection for the health and safety of the public and emergency response personnel; and

WHEREAS, the City of Sacramento Fire Department (hereinafter called "CITY FIRE") has developed a formal hazardous material response team concept (hereinafter called "HAZ-MAT TEAM"), the description and capabilities of which are set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the cost of establishing and maintaining a hazardous material response team capability is so expensive and the occurrence of emergency response incidents requiring the specialized expertise of a hazardous material response team is so infrequent that "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" have determined it would be more economical, feasible and appropriate to utilize the services of the "HAZ-MAT TEAM" available from "CITY FIRE" rather than to develop and maintain duplicate response teams in various locations in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County; and

WHEREAS, "COUNTY" has also determined that it would be more economical and appropriate to utilize the services of the "HAZ-MAT TEAM" available from "CITY FIRE" rather than to develop and maintain a separate response team capability for hazardous materials incidents in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County where fire, or the threat thereof, is not a factor; and

WHEREAS, the specialized services of a hazardous materials response team are above and beyond the normal response services provided on a reciprocal basis as contemplated under the provi-

sions of the California Disaster and Civil Defense Master Mutual Aid Agreement to which all the parties hereto are signatories; and

WHEREAS, "CITY FIRE" has offered, subject to consideration, to provide the services of its "HAZ-MAT TEAM" to "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" and to "COUNTY" under the provisions of a special mutual aid agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Immediately upon notification of any and all incidents in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County, which potentially or actually involve hazardous materials, "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" shall respond as the primary agency for the classification of the level of the incident as defined in the Sacramento Fire Department Hazardous Materials Emergency Response Plan and for the mitigation and suppression of the hazards to life and property resulting from the incident.

2. When the emergency situation is classified as a LEVEL I incident, "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" shall handle the mitigation and suppression of the hazards with the personnel, equipment, supplies and resources immediately available through normal channels.

3. When the emergency situation is classified as a LEVEL II or LEVEL III incident, "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" shall:

(a) Dispatch a chief officer to the scene to serve as the Incident Commander in charge of the response to the incident by all fire agency personnel;

(b) Contact the "CITY FIRE" Dispatch Center and request the services of a "HAZ-MAT TEAM";

(c) Contact either the California Highway Patrol Communications Center for ON-ROAD incidents or the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office Communications Center for OFF-ROAD incidents and request the dispatch of an officer qualified to serve as the Scene Manager who shall be responsible for coordination of the response activities of all involved public agencies;

(d) Contact the Sacramento County Communications Center and advise as to any additional assistance that may be needed; and

(e) Attempt to identify the type and quantity of material involved and any potential exposure or contamination problems and take any and all further actions considered necessary and appropriate to protect the health and safety of the public and emergency response personnel.

4. Immediately upon notification by "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" or "COUNTY" of an emergency situation involving hazardous materials that has been classified as a LEVEL II or LEVEL III incident, "CITY FIRE" shall dispatch a "HAZ-MAT TEAM" to respond to the scene. If more than two (2) LEVEL II or LEVEL III hazardous materials incidents are occurring simultaneously within the City or County of Sacramento, the determination of the priority of response by a "HAZ-MAT TEAM" shall be at the sole discretion of the highest ranking chief officer of "CITY FIRE" on-duty or on-call at the time.

5. Immediately upon arrival at the scene of the emergency hazardous materials incident, the "HAZ-MAT TEAM" Battalion Chief shall proceed to serve as the Liaison Officer through the Incident Commander of the "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT" having jurisdiction, with the Scene Manager provided by either the California Highway Patrol or the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office, with any "COUNTY" representative, and with the official representatives of all other public agencies which are involved in the response to the incident.

6. The services to be provided by the "HAZ-MAT TEAM" to "COUNTY" or "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" shall include the following:

(a) Size-up of the scene, assessment as to the appropriate classification of the level of the incident, determination of any additional protective measures that may be required without further delay, and determination of the possible need for any additional assistance not already requested;

(b) Provision of rescue and first aid to victims, if necessary, and if possible without exposing emergency response personnel to unreasonable life threatening risks;

(c) Identification of the types and quantities of any hazardous materials involved, determination of the hazards they pose to life and property, and advice as to appropriate measures necessary to mitigate, contain and suppress the emergency hazardous materials incident;

(d) Contacting CHEMTREC or any other specialized agencies that may be available to provide technical information regarding the hazardous materials involved in the incident. In view of the fact that CHEMTREC will respond only to the first agency contacting them for information regarding a specific incident, preference shall be given to "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" or "CITY FIRE" for initiating all such contacts;

(e) Provision of advice, assistance and special supplies in the extinguishment of any fires that may exist or pose a threat, if such extinguishment is considered by the Liaison Officer and Incident Commander to be essential, and in the selection of extinguishing agents to be utilized and the methods by which they should be applied;

(f) Provision of advice, assistance and special supplies in the suppression and containment of the hazardous materials involved in the incident including measures such as temporary diking, diverting, channeling, plugging, removal of fuel, and the elimination of ignition sources;

(g) Provision of advice and assistance in the establishment of a Field Command Post in an appropriate and safe location;

(h) Provision of advice and assistance in the establishment of a Resource Pool Staging Area in an appropriate and safe location;

(i) Provision of advice and assistance in the determination and establishment of any restricted or limited access zones that may need to be established and in the determination and establishment of any areas that may need to be evacuated;

(j) Provision of technical coordination with any private sector resources that may be involved in response to the emergency hazardous materials incidents;

(k) Provision of advice and assistance to the Department of Health, the Department of Public Works, and the Emergency Operations Division of the Department of General Services of "COUNTY" as may be requested for the purposes of declaring a health emergency or a state of emergency, coordinating emergency response activities of "COUNTY" departments, and clean-up and restoration of the affected site to normal daily use;

(l) Provision of technical information to the Scene Manager for dissemination to the public through the facilities of the Emergency Broadcast System or directly to the news media regarding the emergency hazardous materials incident;

(m) Provision of advice and assistance, as available, in the training of "COUNTY" and "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS" emergency response personnel; and

(n) Provision of information as to the cost of the response by "HAZ-MAT TEAM" when appropriate and necessary

for recovery of such costs from the party or parties responsible for causing the emergency hazardous materials incident.

7. Immediately upon notification by "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS", "CITY FIRE", or the California Highway Patrol Communications Center of an emergency situation involving hazardous materials in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County that has been classified as a LEVEL II or LEVEL III incident, "COUNTY" shall:

(a) Dispatch a patrol unit from the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office to provide assistance to the Scene Manager of the California Highway Patrol for all ON-ROAD incidents or dispatch an officer with the rank of Sergeant or above to serve as Scene Manager for all OFF-ROAD incidents;

(b) Dispatch patrol units as required from the Sacramento County Sheriff's Office to conduct any evacuation of the civilian population that may be required;

(c) Dispatch any Fire First Responders, Advanced Life Support Teams and emergency ambulances that may be required;

(d) Dispatch the County Emergency Communications Van with supporting supplies, equipment and personnel as requested to the scene;

(e) Dispatch Radiological Monitoring and Dosimetry Control personnel with specialized radiological monitoring and decontamination equipment as requested for emergency incidents involving radiological materials other than

emergency incidents associated with the Rancho Seco Nuclear Generation Station;

(f) Dispatch appropriate personnel from the Emergency Operations Division of the Department of General Services and from the Health Department, as necessary, and, as may be requested whenever the declaration of a health emergency or a state of emergency may be considered necessary and appropriate;

(g) Dispatch personnel from the Sacramento County Agricultural Commissioner's Office whenever the emergency hazardous materials incident involves licensed pest control operators or dangerous toxic substances utilized by the agricultural industry;

(h) Dispatch personnel from the Sacramento County Department of Public Works as promptly as possible after termination of the emergency phase of the hazardous materials incident for the purpose of directing and supervising the clean-up and restoration of the site to its normal use;

(i) Coordinate the requests for any additional mutual aid support that may be needed from other local, state or federal agencies, provide support staff for any Field Command Post and Emergency Operations Center activities that may be needed; and

(j) Coordinate the gathering and compilation of the emergency incident response costs incurred by local agencies

and arrange for the filing of claims for the recovery of such costs from the party or parties responsible for causing the emergency hazardous materials incident or from any other sources of funding that may be available.

8. In recognition of the amount of capital invested by "CITY" to provide the equipment, supplies and resources for the "HAZ-MAT TEAMS", "COUNTY" shall contribute within thirty (30) days after execution of this agreement by "CITY" and "COUNTY" the sum of one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000.00) to "CITY" in order to have the special mutual aid services of the "HAZ-MAT TEAMS" available for emergency incidents in the unincorporated area of Sacramento County, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this agreement.

9. In recognition of the continuing annual costs for equipment maintenance and those emergency response expenses that may not be recoverable from other sources, "COUNTY" shall also contribute within thirty (30) days after execution of this agreement by "CITY" and "COUNTY" the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) as its share of such costs for a period of five calendar years after the effective date of this agreement.

10. The Sacramento City Fire Chief, the Sacramento County Emergency Operations Coordinator and the President of the Sacramento County Fire Chiefs Association are hereby designated as the official representatives of the parties to this agreement for the purposes of: (1) assessing and making recommendations as to any additional equipment, and the financing thereof,

that may be required; (2) reviewing the annual maintenance costs; and (3) by not later than January 1, 1988, making recommendations as to the amount and financing of continuing annual maintenance costs.

11. This agreement, insofar as it affects "CITY" and "COUNTY", shall remain in full force and effect from December 31, 1982 through December 31, 1987, and until such time thereafter that it is terminated by either "CITY" or "COUNTY" upon six (6) months advance written notice served by the terminating party upon the non-terminating party. Such notice shall be deemed effective for all purposes and served on the date it is deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, and addressed as follows:

12. This agreement, insofar as it affects "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICTS", shall become effective within the jurisdiction of each "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT" immediately upon the date of approval by the Board of Directors of each "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT" and shall remain in effect until terminated by the Board of Directors of each such "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT" upon six (6) months advance written notice served by the terminating "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT"

upon "CITY" and "COUNTY" and addressed as heretofore provided in Section 11 of this agreement.

13. With respect to any emergency hazardous materials incident occurring within the unincorporated area of Sacramento County and within the jurisdictional boundaries of any "COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT" that has not elected to become a party to this special mutual aid agreement, "COUNTY" shall have the right to request a special mutual aid response from a "HAZ-MAT-TEAM" for any and all incidents where fire, or the threat thereof, is not a factor and a response by "COUNTY" departments is required.

14. In all other matters involving Mutual Aid that are not expressly covered by the terms and conditions of this agreement, the terms and conditions of the California Disaster and Civil Defense Master Mutual Aid Agreement, all incorporated herein by reference, shall apply.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this agreement effective the day, month and year herein provided.





RESPONSIBILITIES OF HMRT

6 DECEMBER 82

SUBJECT: DESCRIPTION OF RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SACRAMENTO FIRE DEPARTMENT HAZARDOUS MATERIALS RESPONSE TEAM, AS THEY RELATE TO RESPONSE, HANDLING, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE HAZARDOUS MATERIAL INCIDENT.

I. INCLUSION

- A. The Sacramento Fire Department Hazardous Materials Response Team shall be comprised of:
1. A "Truck Company", which includes a Ladder Truck, a Light Plant unit, with a crew of 3 fire fighters and 1 Captain:
 2. A Battalion Chief to function as liaison officer.
- B. The Hazardous Materials Response Team, hereinafter referred to as HMRT, shall respond:
1. On a mutual aid bases to anywhere into the County of Sacramento:
 2. On a mutual aid bases to a maximum limit of 50 nautical miles radius from the City Limits of Sacramento:
 3. When such request for response is made from a fire agency.

II. REPORTING AT SCENE

- A. The HMRT shall respond to the scene of a reported hazardous material incident. The HMRT will check in at the established temporary or field command post for further directions, or, to the Incident Commander of the Fire Department having jurisdiction.
1. The Battalion Chief will report to the Senior ranking Chief Officer of the fire department having jurisdiction,

who usually will be located in the vicinity of the command post. The Battalion Chief shall function as the Liaison Officer representing the Sacramento Fire Department and shall work with the Incident Commander and Scene Manager.

2. The HMRT Officer shall report to the Officer of the fire department having jurisdiction who is in control of the immediate on-scene activities. The HMRT Officer will coordinate his crews activities with him.

III. RESPONSIBILITIES

- A. HMRT Officer will assist in size-up of the incident. He will suggest to the Incident Commander having jurisdiction methods of handling and controlling the incident, procedures for containment, and any advice he deems pertinent to aid in the abatement of the hazardous material. This advice may include, but not be limited to:
 1. Techniques for rescue and first aid, if it is necessary, if it is possible, and without unnecessary risk to Fire Fighters.
 2. Suggestions to extinguishing procedures, if it is necessary, if it is advisable and prudent; type of extinguishing agent; method of application, etc.
 3. Containment of incident - including suggesting methods dyking, diverting, and channeling if not already begun; plugging of leaks, removal of fuel or chemicals from containers; and elimination of ignition sources.
 4. Identification of the materials to the HMRT Officers fullest satisfaction; recommend use of other Haz-Mat teams and industrial assistance.
 5. Suggestions as to Command Post - if one is necessary; location of Command Post, etc. This would also include utilization of a Resource Pool, as the incident warrents
 6. Suggestions as to additional equipment - for manpower; for equipment; assignment of sector officers; for use in the implementation of other tasks such as evacuation, attending the injured, channeling, etc.

- B. The HMRT and its crew will be solely responsible for the specialized equipment and gear found on the HMRT Unit. Only members of the Sacramento Fire Department Hazardous Material Response Team shall use, and operate such equipment, and such equipment shall not be loaned to any other agency.
- C. The HMRT Battalion Chief will assist in overall long range planning functions as they relate to the operation of the HMRT, and shall coordinate all such planning in cooperation with the Fire Department Incident Commander and the Scene Manager at the Command Post. The Battalion Chief, functioning as liaison officer to the Fire Department having jurisdiction, shall provide advice as necessary to assist in abating the hazard. Such advice may include, but not be limited to:
1. Suggested location of Command Post; suggested location of Resource Pool.
 2. Additional outside agency response which may become necessary to notify and summon.
 3. State and Federal agency notification, depending on seriousness of incident, and various State and Federal requirements.
 4. Providing the fullest assistance to accompany the HMRT Officer and his crew.
 5. Assisting in suggesting best ways to initiate and coordinate evacuation.
 6. In harmony with the HMRT, identify and establish "Limited Access Zone" and "Restricted Access Zone" as may be necessary commensurate with the hazard.
 7. Keeping the Fire Department Incident Commander, Scene Manager, and the Command Post informed and updated as to the functions of the HMRT at the scene.

IV. SPECIALIZED SERVICES

- A. The HMRT may provide a wide range of specialized services at the scene. These specialized services will be as a result of the technical training given to the HMRT Officers, and the equipment made available to them. As deemed necessary by the HMRT Officer, these services may include, but will not be limited to:

1. Effecting entry into highly contaminated and toxic area; when so done, will be with chemical entry suits equipped with escape and embilical air supply, radio communications, inter-cooling air; system to be used only by members of the HMRT.
2. Selection of completely inert non-sparking beryllium copper alloy tools.
3. Selection of variety of gloves and other ancillary protective gear, depending on type of chemical hazard.
4. Chemicals and mechanical devices to assist in patch leaks; kits developed to plug holes from pinhole size to 2½".
5. Providing capability to determine presence of flammable vapors in atmosphere, or toxic gases, with special detection equipment; to determine reduction of residual oxygen; to detect leaks.

V. CONTAINMENT

- A. The HMRT Battalion Chief shall be in direct communication with Sacramento Fire Alarm at all times. In conjunction with the Incident Commander, the B.C. will be working with a set of predesigned reports and guides arranged in a systematic manner, based on chemical hazard class. Using these guides, the HMRT Officer and Battalion Chief will be able to determine what City, County, State, Federal, and Private Industry contacts that may or should be notified. These guides will be in the possession of the HMRT Officer, the Battalion Chief, Fire Alarm and the S.F.D. Command Post.
- B. The HMRT for the most part shall always assist in helping implement and guide those procedures that will bring the incident to a state of containment, with the highest regard to safety. It will be rare that the Sacramento Fire Department or the HMRT will engage itself in any cleanup operations, and only then when it is determined that such a decision will result in the best possible action to abate the hazard safely and without injury or harm to the members of the HMRT.
- C. The HMRT will remain on the scene as necessary during off-loading containment, and cleanup stages to insure to the satisfaction of the HMRT Officer that such operations are done so safely, correctly, and to function in an advisory capacity.
