**ACCEPTANCE OF THE EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL
JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM**

- A. The U.S. Department of Justice, Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program allows state and local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system. The JAG Program replaces the Byrne Formula and Local Law Enforcement Block Grant programs with a single funding mechanism. Forty percent of the JAG funding is designated for units of local government.
- B. As a designated eligible applicant, the Sacramento Police Department was allowed to apply for up to \$226,836 in JAG funding. The Police Department is requesting approval to accept and use, if awarded, \$226,836 in Federal funding.

**BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL
RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:**

- 1. The City Manager, or his designated representative, is hereby authorized, on behalf of the City of Sacramento, to accept Federal JAG funds in the amount of \$226,836, including any extensions or amendments thereof, to supplement law enforcement services and purchase equipment for public safety.
- 2. The Grant Operating Expense and Revenue budgets shall be amended as follows:


