SUBJECT: Crocker Art Museum Grant Application

### SUMMARY

This report describes and recommends a grant application to the California Arts Council for \$15,000 to expand the Crocker Art Museum's Outreach Program.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The California Arts Council is offering grant opportunities to local art agencies to expand public participation programs to aid in the development of new audiences and art activities.

The Crocker Art Museum Division has developed a Museum "I.D." (Imagination Development) Education Program aimed at utilizing \$15,000 in CAC funds to expand the following programs:

1. The "Art Ark", mobile arts education program, emphasizes art education in area schools.
2. The "Family Festivals", a series of 9 monthly community art workshops for all ages.
3. "The Hands See" tactile show, a semi-permanent museum installation designed to serve the blind and partially sighted persons.

### FINANCIAL DATA

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The \$15,000 California Arts Council grant requires a \$15,000 match. Matching funds will be solicited from private and corporate



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sources and the Museum Program of the National Endowment of the Arts. Indirect costs of \$3,508 to the City for staff salaries and benefits will be included as part of the local matching funds.

RECOMMENDATION



RESOLUTION APPROVING APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDS UNDER THE CALIFORNIA ARTS COUNCIL'S EXPANDING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROGRAM FOR THE MUSEUM'S "I.D." (IMAGINATION DEVELOPMENT) EDUCATION PROGRAM.

WHEREAS, The California Arts Council has established the Matching Grant Program for Expanding Public Participation, which provides funds to certain non-profit organizations for developing new audiences and arts activities in which the public can participate; and,

WHEREAS, the procedures established by the California Arts Council's Expanding Public Participation program require the City of Sacramento, hereinafter referred to as "Applicant" to certify by resolution the approval of applications prior to submission of said applications; and

WHEREAS, said applications contain a certification that the applicant will comply with all federal, state, and local environmental, public health, and affirmative action requirements and all other appropriate codes, laws, and regulations prior to the expenditure of the grant funds;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY COUNCIL HEREBY:

1. Approves the filing of an application for funding under the California Arts Council's Expanding Public Participation Program; and,
2. Certifies that the Applicant understands the general provisions of the agreement; and,
3. Appoints the City Manager as agent of the Applicant to conduct all negotiations, execute and submit all documents including, but not limited to, applications, agreements, amendments, payment requests, and so on which may be necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.
