The attached report will be reviewed by the Budget and Finance Committee at their meeting of September 23, 1987. Results of that meeting will be presented orally to the City Council.


RECOMMENDATION

SUBJECT: Sacramento Science Center Planetarium Terrestrial Projector - 1986  
Bond Act

SUMMARY

This report requests that City Council approve, by resolution, amendment of the City of Sacramento's FY 1987-88 grant application under the 1986 Bond Act by including the purchase of a planetarium terrestrial projector and foul weather canopies for the front walk and entrance to the planetarium.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Sacramento Science Center's planetarium is the only public facility of its kind in the Sacramento area and, as such, provides a unique educational opportunity for the entire area. The Science Center offers approximately 400 programs at the planetarium to an estimated 19,200 people per year.

The present planetarium terrestrial projector is over 20 years old and badly in need of repair. Many of the parts are no longer available and as a result, the reliability of the instrument is in doubt and programs have been delayed or cancelled.

The Science Center has been assured a completely refurbished and guaranteed instrument can be acquired. This projector will provide reliability as well as the ability to upgrade current Science Center program offerings.

On November 5, 1986, City Council approved the Department of Parks and Community Services' three-year program of grant applications under the 1986 Bond Act grant program. Included in the FY 1987-88 grant request is the Sacramento Science Center rehabilitation. This project includes replacement of worn carpet and tile, correction of mechanical and electrical deficiencies, re-roofing, parking lot security lighting, signage for exhibits, and the addition of 900 square feet of shop and storage space.

Staff recommends that the purchase of the planetarium terrestrial projector and foul weather canopies for the front walk and entrance to the planetarium be substituted for the exhibit signage and construction of shop and storage space. State Parks and Recreation grants officials have indicated their approval for this amendment to the FY 1987-88 grant.

FINANCIAL DATA

Substitution of the planetarium projector and foul weather canopies for the exhibit signage and shop and storage space will have no effect on the total cost of the Sacramento Science Center rehabilitation. Total estimated cost of this project is \$75,000 and has been included in the City CIP budget for FY 1987-88. Funding sources are as follows:

Sacramento Science Center Rehabilitation

1986 Bond Act Grant	\$50,000
Science Center Fund Raising	<u>25,000</u>


TOTAL: \$75,000

No additional City funds are requested.


RECOMMENDATION
