RE: Agreement between City, County, SRTD and SACOG
relating to Paratransit.

Honorable Members in Session:

SUMMARY

The attached Resolution approves the agreement between the City, County of Sacramento, the Sacramento Regional Transit District and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments, which provides for the continuation of transportation services to the elderly and handicapped to be performed by Paratransit Inc. This agreement has been prepared at the request of the City Council.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The City Council has instructed the staff to develop a four party agreement relating to transportation services for the elderly and handicapped. The Agreement will be sent to the Council no later than Monday, June 29, 1981. The agreement is for a one year term commencing August 1, 1981. The agreement provides for the transportation services to be performed by Paratransit Inc., subject to certain conditions. One of the conditions is that Paratransit must reconstitute its board in the manner provided in the agreement. The board would be made up of nine members with three members appointed by the Council, three by the County, two by the Board of Directors of Regional Transit and one by Sacramento Area Council of Governments. Two members of the board would be users of the transportation service. The City would contribute \$650,000 to SACOG, which SACOG in turn would pay to Paratransit if Paratransit has complied with the terms of the agreement. SACOG would monitor the services to be provided by Paratransit and assure that Paratransit has complied with the terms of the agreement.

In order for the City Council to make its appointments to this Paratransit Board by August 1, 1981, it will be necessary for the Council to expedite the appointment process. The Council should discuss this issue at its meeting on June 30, 1981.

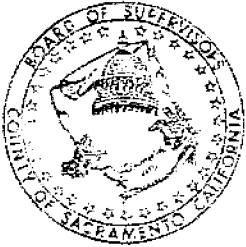

RE: Paratransit Operation

The Board of Supervisors, at a regular meeting held Thursday, June 18, 1981, directed that in view of Regional Transit's Resolution No. 81-793, the Board reaffirms its decision of June 11, 1981, that Paratransit be designated as a consolidated transportation service agency; that the City, County, SACOG and Regional Transit enter into an agreement to provide funding for and establish conditions related to Paratransit's operation for a year and that Regional Transit's legal counsel take the lead in preparing the four-party agreement.

The Board also designated the Chairman of the Board to confer with the Regional Transit Board respecting ultimate responsibility for Paratransit's operation.
