SUBJECT: CALLING AND CONSOLIDATING A PRIMARY MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 7, 2000 AND GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD NOVEMBER 7, 2000

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: City-wide; Council Districts 2, 4, 6, 8, and Mayor

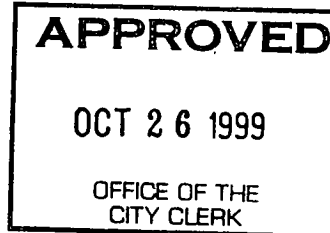
SUMMARY

This report requests that the City Council adopt the attached resolutions: (1) calling and giving notice of a Primary Municipal Election to be held on March 7, 2000, and (2) requesting that the elections be consolidated with the Statewide Primary and General Elections; and (3) that the County Board of Supervisors instruct the County Registrar of Voters to provide specified services in connection with the election.

BACKGROUND

The terms for incumbents in City Council Districts 2, 4, 6, 8, and the Mayor will expire in November 2000. Pursuant to established procedures, the Office of the City Clerk is calling and giving notice of a Primary Municipal Election to be held on March 7, 2000 to fill these vacancies, and a General Municipal Election

to be held on November 7, 2000 if a run-off election is necessary. In accordance with the City Charter, the regular Primary and General elections are to be consolidated with the Statewide Primary and General Elections.

In order to obtain specific election services from the County Registrar of Voters it is necessary to adopt the attached resolution requesting the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors to instruct the Registrar to provide such services.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Funds are available in the City Clerk's election budget to accommodate all routine costs associated with these elections. The cost of the March Primary Municipal Election is estimated to be \$108,000. The cost of the November election will depend on whether a run-off election is necessary in any of the four districts and/or Mayor's position, and whether a measure is called to the ballot. At this time, it is estimated that the City's participation in a November General Municipal Election will cost between \$64,000 and \$195,000.



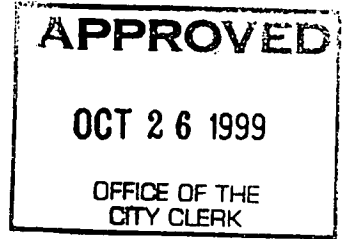

RESOLUTION CALLING AND GIVING NOTICE OF A PRIMARY MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MARCH 7, 2000, AND OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2000, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS (DISTRICTS 2, 4, 6, 8 AND MAYOR) AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO CHARTER CITIES

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the laws relating to charter cities in the State of California, a Primary Municipal Election shall be held on March 7, 2000, and a General Municipal Election shall be held on November 7, 2000, for the election of Municipal Officers;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to charter cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Sacramento, California, on Tuesday, March 7, 2000, a Primary Municipal Election, and on Tuesday, November 7, 2000, a General Municipal Election, for the purpose of electing five members of the City Council (Districts 2, 4, 6, 8, and Mayor) for the full term of four years.

SECTION 2. That the ballots to be used at the election shall be in form and content as required by law.

SECTION 3. That the polls for the election shall be open at 7:00 a.m. of the day of the election and shall remain open continuously from that time until 8:00 p.m. of the same day when the polls shall be closed, except as provided in Section 14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

SECTION 4. That in all particulars not recited in this resolution, the election shall be held and conducted as provided by law for holding municipal elections.

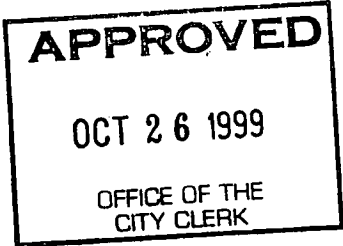

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO TO CONSOLIDATE THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO'S PRIMARY MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 7, 2000 AND GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 7, 2000 WITH THE STATEWIDE PRIMARY AND GENERAL ELECTIONS TO BE HELD ON THESE DATES PURSUANT TO SECTION 10403 OF THE CALIFORNIA ELECTIONS CODE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento called a Primary Municipal Election to be held on March 7, 2000 and a General Municipal Election to be held on November 7, 2000 for the purposes of the election of five members of the City Council in Districts 2, 4, 6, 8 and the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, IT IS DESIRABLE THAT THE Primary and General Municipal Elections be consolidated with the Statewide Primary and General Elections to be held on the same date and that within the City the precincts, polling places and election officers of the elections be the same, and that the County Registrar of Voters of the County of Sacramento canvass the returns of the Primary and General Municipal Elections and that all elections be held in all respects as if there were only one election;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to the requirements of Section 10403 of the Elections Code, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sacramento is hereby requested to consent and agrees to the consolidation of a Primary Municipal Election with the Statewide Primary Election on Tuesday, March 7, 2000 and the General Municipal Election with the Statewide General Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 7, 2000, for the purposes of the election of five members of the City Council.

SECTION 2. That the county Election Department is authorized to canvass the returns of the Primary and General Municipal Elections. The elections shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.

SECTION 3. That the Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Election Department to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

SECTION 4. That the City of Sacramento recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County of any costs.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County Election Department of the County of Sacramento.

SECTION 6. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO TO ORDER THE COUNTY REGISTRAR OF VOTERS TO RENDER CERTAIN ELECTION SERVICES TO THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO IN CONNECTION WITH THE CONDUCTING OF A MARCH 7, 2000 PRIMARY MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND A NOVEMBER 7, 2000 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION PURSUANT TO SECTION 10002 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Board of Supervisors of the County of Sacramento is hereby requested to order the County Registrar of Voters to render the following services in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of the California Elections Code to the City of Sacramento in connection with the conducting of a Primary Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, March 7, 2000 and a General Municipal Election to be held on Tuesday, November 7, 2000:

- a. Examine the signatures upon any nomination paper or petition of any candidate for municipal office.
- b. Establish precincts and polling places, secure election officers, and prepare and mail notices of appointment.
- c. Purchase precinct supplies and absentee voter supplies.
- d. Print sample ballots and polling place cards, including the statements of candidate's qualifications and mail to registered voters.
- e. Transport voting booths, ballots, original books of affidavits, ballot boxes and precinct supplies to precincts.
- f. Provide printed official ballots.

- g. Provide for absentee voting through the Office of the County Registrar of Voters.
- h. Supervise and conduct election.
- i. Tabulate electronic votes.
- j. Perform all things necessary or incidental to accomplish the above functions in conducting the election.

SECTION 2. That the County Election Department is authorized to canvass and certify the returns of the Primary and General Municipal Election.

SECTION 3. That the City of Sacramento recognizes that costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this election and agrees to reimburse the County of any costs.

SECTION 4. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County Election Department of the County of Sacramento.

SECTION 5. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
