

RESOLUTION No. 762

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO TO SUBMIT CERTAIN PROPOSALS FOR THE AMENDMENT OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO; FIXING THE TIME OF THE ELECTION AT WHICH SUCH PROPOSALS SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE ELECTORS; AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO ADVERTISE SAID PROPOSED AMENDMENTS, AND TO CAUSE NOTICE THEREOF TO BE PRINTED AND ADVERTISED FOR DISTRIBUTION.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO:

That it is the intention of the Council of the City of Sacramento to submit on its own motion to the qualified electors of the City of Sacramento at a special municipal election to be held on November 2 1937, which date is hereby fixed as the date of holding such election, certain proposals for amending various sections of the charter of the City of Sacramento, which proposals are more fully set forth as follows:

PROPOSAL 1.

To add a new section numbered 26a to the Charter of the City of Sacramento to read as follows:

ADOPTION OF CODES.

"Sec. 26a: Any and all ordinances which have been enacted and published in accordance with the provisions of this Charter, and which have not been repealed, may be compiled, revised, indexed and arranged as a comprehensive ordinance code and such code adopted by reference by the passage of an ordinance for such purpose. Not less than three (3) copies of such code shall be filed for use in examination by the public in the office of the City Clerk.

Where rules and regulations for the construction of buildings, the installation of plumbing, the installation of electric wiring, or other similar work, have been printed as a code in book form, such code may be adopted by reference by the passage of an ordinance for such purpose. Not less than three (3) copies of such code shall be filed for use in examination by the public in the office of the City Clerk."

PROPOSAL 2.

To repeal Sections 184, 192 and 274 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento.

PROPORTIONAL REPRESENTATION

Sections 184, 192 and 274 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento are hereby repealed.

PROPOSAL 3.

To repeal Section 273 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento.

BALLOTS AND VOTING

Section 273 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento is hereby repealed.

PROPOSAL 4.

As an alternative to proposal No. 3.

To amend Section 273 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento to read as follows:

Section 273: The full name of all regularly nominated candidates shall be printed on the official ballot in alphabetical order of the surnames.

PROPOSAL 5.

To amend Section 186 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento To

Read as follows:

REGULATION OF ELECTIONS

Section 186: The City Council shall make all needful rules and regulations not inconsistent with the general law for the conduct of elections, for the prevention of fraud in elections, and for the recount of the ballot in case of doubt or fraud.

PROPOSAL 6.

To amend Section 194 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento to read as follows:

CITY BOARD OF CANVASSERS.

Section 194: The Council shall constitute a City Board of Canvassers and they shall meet at the City Hall on the second Thursday next succeeding any city election, at eight o'clock in the evening of that day, and shall canvass the result of the election. The City Council shall thereupon enter this result upon the official records of the city.

PROPOSAL 7.

To repeal Sections 93 and 94 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento And to amend Section 92 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento.

FORM AND SALE OF BONDS

Sections 93 and 94 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento are hereby repealed.

MUNICIPAL BONDS

Section 92 of the Charter of the City of Sacramento is hereby amended to read as follows:-

Section 92: The General Laws of the State of California authorizing the incurring of and establishing the procedure for the creation of a bonded indebtedness, including refunding bonds, of municipalities in force at the time any bonded indebtedness is created or refunded by the City shall be applicable to the creation of bonded indebtedness and the issuance of refunding bonds by the City. None of the provisions of this Charter relating to elections shall be applicable to any bond election, except to the extent referred to or incorporated in the ordinance calling such bond election. No error, irregularity or omission which does not affect the substantial rights of the City or its taxpayers shall invalidate any bond election held hereunder or any proceedings leading up to the issuance of any bonds of the City. All bonds issued by the City shall be incontestable from and after the time of payment of the principal amount thereof and accrued interest thereon to date of delivery into the City Treasury.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk be, and he is hereby, directed:

(a) To cause such proposed amendments to be published once in the "Sacramento Union", the official newspaper of said City, and in each edition thereof during the day of publication.

(b) To cause copies of said proposed amendments of said charter to be printed in convenient pamphlet form on or before ten days from the date of the passage of this resolution (said pamphlet to name the date of said election.)


(c) To advertise the same in the "Sacramento Union", official newspaper of the City of Sacramento and a paper of general circulation published in said City of Sacramento, a notice that copies may be had in the office of the City Clerk upon application therefor. Said notice to be published in said paper daily commencing as soon as copies are printed, and ending on the date of said election.

(d) To mail copies of such pamphlets to be so made to each of the qualified electors of such City.
