**SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE OF EXTENSION OF GRANT FROM CALIFORNIA
DEPARTMENT OF TOXIC SUBSTANCE CONTROL.**

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council authorize the City Manager to sign an acceptance of extension of a grant with the California Department of Toxic Substance Control (DTSC).

SUMMARY:

This report requests approval of the City Council for the City Manager to sign an extension of an existing grant agreement. The \$40,000 grant from the California Department of Toxic Substance Control had not been fully executed and expired on January 31, 1999. The California Department of Toxic Substance Control has authorized this extension through April 31, 1999.

BACKGROUND:

This grant is an extension of a grant in progress and was not fully executed. In an attempt to take full advantage of the available funds an extension was requested and accepted by the California Department of Toxic Substance Control. This is not a matching funds grant.

The grant is for the purchase of chemical protective clothing, toxic gas monitoring instruments, a trailer, and various containerization modules (storage cases).

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

No City funds are required for these purchases.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Ongoing administrative and maintenance activities, such as purchases of supplies, equipment or materials which are not made for purposes of a public works construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act. CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

Acceptance of the extension of this grant is consistent with the continued cooperative efforts between the Fire Department and the California Department of Toxic Substance Control.
