SUMMARY

This report provides information relating to the receipt of two Jobs Bill grants through the California Conservation Corps (CCC) and the California Department of Forestry (CDF) and requests authorization to execute grant-related agreements.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Federal government passed a summer Jobs Bill (PL-98-8) which provided funding to the states for projects to be accomplished during the time period of July 1 through October 1, 1983. The purpose of the bill is to fund projects which would employ unemployed people and would stimulate small business firms.

This was reported to the Council on June 21, 1983 and Resolution #83-457 was passed authorizing the City Manager and Department of Community Services to submit applications for projects to utilize these grant fundings. The City submitted applications for four projects. On a state-wide basis, several hundred applications were submitted and twelve were awarded in the central valley area. The City of Sacramento received two of the grants, one for a CCC project and one for a CDF project.

The CCC project budgeted at \$20,000 will provide for the CCC to employ up to 14 people in a crew which will perform such duties as cleaning weeds and planting trees along Pocket Canal system. The only City participation in this project is to provide general direction as to locations where the work is to be performed and such minor training as needed to accomplish the project. No special City funding is involved.

The CDF project funded at \$20,000 is to award a contract to a small business tree trimmer who would employ currently unemployed tree trimmers to remove hazardous elm trees throughout the Old City Community of Sacramento. The trees to be removed have been selected by the City's Tree Services Arborist and are part of the elm reforestation program as approved by the City Council last year. This project will require that the City bid and award the contract and be reimbursed by CDF at completion of the project. The bids specifications will be prepared and submitted to City Council for approval.

FINANCIAL DATA

The CCC project is estimated at \$20,000, which will be provided as a service by CCC employees. The CDF elm reforestation project cost is \$20,000. Grant funds will be utilized to provide a \$20,000 reduction of General Fund support of the elm tree reforestation program. This \$20,000 General Fund reduction will be included as a portion of the Department's contribution toward the City-wide \$2.0 million cut to meet the current budget deficit.

RECOMMENDATION


It is recommended that the City Council authorize, by resolution, the City Manager to execute agreements for acceptance of the grants from the California Department of Forestry and the California Conservation Corps.
