STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Adopt the attached Resolution which includes the acceptance of a Regional Community Policing Institute grant award of \$1,000,000, the augmentation of the Police Department's Grant Operating Budget, and the authorization to increase the Police Department's staffing level by one (1) FTE Police Captain, one (1) FTE Police Sergeant, two (2) FTE Administrative Analysts, and one (1) FTE Police Clerk during the one year grant period.

SUMMARY

The City of Sacramento and the Sacramento Police Department have been awarded a federal grant under the Regional Community Policing Institutes (RCPI) grant program. The RCPI program approved funding for \$1,000,000 to establish the "Community Policing Institute of Sacramento" (CPIS). There is no City match for this grant. The grant period is for one year, with the possibility of second and third year funding.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Sacramento Police Department requested funding from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services to establish a Regional Community Policing Institute, known as the Community Policing Institute of Sacramento. Principal partners to engage in this effort include the Sacramento Police Department (SPD), the California Attorney General's (AG) Office, the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST), the California State University at Sacramento (CSUS), and a community based organization known as SAFE STREETS, Inc. A police department staff of one (1) FTE Police Captain, one (1) FTE Police Sergeant, two (2) Administrative Analysts, and one (1) Police Clerk will facilitate the Institute goals and work closely with partner agencies.

CPIS will develop and deliver community policing training through regional training conferences/workshops, one or more cluster conferences, site visits and regular strategic meetings with the southern California Regional Institutes proposed by the San Diego Police Department and the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department. A train-the-trainer component will be integrated into the plan by using a core of community policing trainers from throughout the region, who will provide instruction to teams of trainers at three proposed regional conferences. Participants of these regional conferences will be able to replicate this training in their own jurisdictions in the Sacramento area and throughout northern California.

Key objectives of the CPIS proposal include the refinement of available community policing training curriculum to reflect state of the art concepts and strategies; expanding participation in community policing training to include Sacramento area law enforcement "practioners", local government officials, and community members; and making this training easily accessible both locally and throughout the region by facilitating attendance and delivering community policing training to various locations throughout the region. The ultimate goal of CPIS and its partners is to develop a consensus among law enforcement agencies and communities which will help establish community policing training as a standard training component of a basic recruit academy and in-service training curriculum for California law enforcement officers in the future.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The total program costs are \$1,000,000. No City match is required. The grant period will be for one year. There is a possibility of funding for a second and third year.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

Approval to apply for grant funding is consistent with past practices. Acceptance of these funds will allow the Police Department to share our expertise, expand community oriented policing training opportunities for the communities and law enforcement personnel, and facilitate the standardization of community oriented policing training.



RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT A \$1,000,000 AWARD FROM THE FEDERAL " REGIONAL COMMUNITY POLICING INSTITUTE" PROGRAM

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to undertake the Community Policing Institute of Sacramento project to be funded from funds made available through the Regional Community Policing Institutes program.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative is hereby authorized to execute a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services in the amount of \$1,000,000 including any extensions or amendments thereof, to implement the Community Policing Institute of Sacramento.
2. The Police Department's staffing level is to be increased by one (1.0 FTE) Police Captain, one (1.0 FTE) Sergeant, two (2.0 FTE) Administrative Analysts, and one (1.0 FTE) Police Clerk during the grant period.
3. The Grant Operating Budget will be increased by a total of \$1,000,000 as follows:
