

RESOLUTION No. 574

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

February 3 1939

WHEREAS, The City of Sacramento, in common with the great Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys as a whole, is vitally interested in the Central Valley Project, and

WHEREAS, the need for morewater and power in the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys is yearly becoming more urgent, and

WHEREAS, the flood control problems on the Sacramento River and its tributaries are steadily increasing, and

WHEREAS, the solving of salinity difficulties in the Delta lands of the Sacramento and San Joaquin Rivers is becoming increasingly important, and

WHEREAS, there has been budgeted by the Federal Government for the Central Valley Project for the next fiscal year the sum of ten million dollars, and


WHEREAS, we believe that an increase in this budget allocation not only would speed up construction on the Central Valley Project, particularly in the southern San Joaquin Valley, and also would materially lessen the unemployment relief problem in California by putting additional men to work,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Sacramento earnestly recommend to Congress that the budget allocation of the Central Valley Project for the next fiscal year be substantially increased, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be sent to Secretary of the Interior, Harold L. Ickes, to Commissioner of the U.S. Eureau of Reclamation, John C. Page, to our Representatives in Congress, to Governor Culbert L. Olson, and to Frank W. Clark, Director of the Department of Public Works of the State of California.
