Title: Grant Application: Annual Federal Funds for California Task Force Seven (CA TF-7), Urban Search and Rescue (US&R) Team

Location/Council District: Citywide

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution: 1)** Authorizing the City Manager, or his designee, to apply, sign and submit documentation for annual federal funding from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS)/Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the California Task Force Seven, Urban Search and Rescue Team (CA TF-7 US&R); **2)** Accepting federal funds, if awarded, in amount awarded; **3)** Establishing an operating grant for CA TF-7 US&R (G12501000) including revenue and expenditure budgets for the CA TF-7 US&R program; **4)** Accepting all eligible, grant related expenditures to the CA TF-7 US&R grant (G12501000) beginning May 1, 2010.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The City of Sacramento is the sponsoring agency for US&R CA TF-7. Each year the City applies for annual federal funding from DHS/FEMA for the operation of CA TF-7. This report is recommending that the City Council authorize the City Manager, or his designee, to apply for the federal funding for Federal Fiscal year 2010 (Federal Fiscal year is October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010), and accept any funds awarded to CA TF-7. Per FEMA, the amount of funding per award, subject to availability, is estimated to range from \$1,001,900 to \$1,050,900.

Policy Considerations: The US&R grant funds will provide federal funds that will be used to staff, train and equip a regional/national emergency response team.

Application for, and acceptance of the federal US&R funding is consistent with City Council action relative to state and federal grant awards.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): Ongoing administrative maintenance activities, such as purchases of supplies, equipment or materials which are not made for purposes of a public construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA Guidelines, Section 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

Sustainability Considerations: There are no sustainability considerations applicable to the applying and acceptance of federal funding reimbursing DHS/FEMA directed activities.


Commission/Committee Action: None.


Rationale for Recommendation: The City of Sacramento Fire Department is the sponsoring agency for the CA TF-7 US&R Team. The team also includes the following participating agencies: County of Sacramento - Airport System, City of Folsom Fire Department, City of West Sacramento Fire Department, Cosumnes Community Services District (CSD) Fire Department, FBA, Inc., Roseville Fire Department, Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, and various affiliated personnel.

The City of Sacramento Fire Department is responsible for organizing, equipping, and maintaining the specialized equipment cache, training task force personnel, and mobilizing the team upon activation. The application process is the first step in the receipt of the annual federal US&R funds. Staff recommends authorization for the City Manager, or his designee, to sign and submit documentation for annual federal grant funding; and if awarded, accept this funding to continue the operations of CA TF-7. Financial Considerations: The approval and adoption of the attached Resolution, is not requesting an augmentation to the Fire Department budget. The CA TF-7 US&R grant funds will be used for personnel costs, training, storage and maintenance, and purchase of supplies and equipment in order to maintain a state of readiness, and to meet the grant reporting and audit requirements. Staff is recommending that an operating grant be established with a revenue and expenditure budget to match the final grant when awarded. If the grant is not awarded, the program ends with the last approved cooperative agreement and funding.

Emerging Small Business Development (ESBD): Staff will follow the emerging and small business guidelines when purchasing any supplies or services under this grant.



GRANT APPLICATION: ANNUAL FEDERAL FUNDS FOR CALIFORNIA TASK FORCE SEVEN (CA TF-7), URBAN SEARCH AND RESCUE (US&R) TEAM

BACKGROUND

- A. The CA TF-7, US&R Team, sponsored by the City of Sacramento, consists of personnel from the City of Sacramento Fire Department, various other participating agencies and affiliated personnel. The Sacramento Fire Department, representing the City as the sponsoring agency, is responsible for organizing, equipping, and maintaining the specialized equipment cache, training task force personnel, and mobilizing the team upon activation.
- B. Each year the City of Sacramento Fire Department, as the sponsoring agency, must submit an application to the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency (DHS/FEMA) to receive annual funding to support the administrative requirements, training, equipment maintenance and/or purchases in order to ensure the task force readiness of CA TF-7. If the grant is not awarded, the program ends with the last approved cooperative agreement and funding.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to apply, sign and submit documentation for annual federal funding from DHS/FEMA for the California Task Force Seven, Urban Search and Rescue Team (CA TF-7 US&R);
- Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to accept federal funds in the amount awarded;
- Section 3. An operating grant for CA TF-7 US&R (G12501000) including revenue and expenditure budgets for the CA TF-7 US&R program shall be established;
- Section 4. All eligible CA TF-7 US&R grant (G12501000) related expenditures beginning May 1, 2010 are accepted.
