

REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
October 5, 1972

The Honorable City Council met in regular session on this date at the hour of 7:32 o'clock p.m., Mayor Marriott presiding and roll call was answered as follows:

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member with a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of the regular meeting of September 28, 1972, were ordered approved.
