SUMMARY:

The report requests approval of Change Order No.1 in the amount of \$47,085.50 for replacement of additional 550 stop signs. This Change Order will allow the City to fully utilize the \$492,000 grant the City received.

City Council 1998 HES Street Stop Sign Replacement Project (PN:RG21) March 4, 1999

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The contract for the Stop Sign Replacement Project was awarded to Russ Enterprises, Inc. in the amount of \$366,588.50 on February 2, 1999. The project is entirely funded from a \$492,000 grant from the Hazard Elimination Safety Program (HES) of the Intermodal Surfacing Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 (ISTEA). Change Order No.1 will replace additional 550 stop signs. Approval of this Change Order will allow the City to fully utilize the federal grant.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The estimated total project cost, including Change Order No. 1, is \$471,674.00. Change Order No. 1 will cost \$47,085.50. As of March 12, 1999, the project has an unencumbered balance of \$107,555.73.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

A Notice of Exemption from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15301 was filed with the County Clerk on December 16, 1998. The project represents a replacement program for existing public facilities and will not cause an adverse impact to the environment.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

Approval of this Change Order therein is consistent with Sacramento City Code, Title 58.

ESBD CONSIDERATIONS:

The project is federally funded and has met Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) requirements.
