**SUBJECT: SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM**

**LOCATION: City Wide**

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

This report recommends that the City Council, by resolution, approve participation in the 1998 Summer Food Service Program and authorize the City Manager to execute all agreements and documents relative to the program including executing an agreement with Elk Grove Unified School District, Del Paso Heights School District, and Elverta School District for the preparation and delivery of lunches and snacks for the program. Further, it recommends amending the FY 1997-98 Budget to reflect the operation of the 1998 Summer Food Service Program.

**SUMMARY**

This report provides information about the 1997/98 Summer Food Service Program which will provide meals throughout the school year to children when they are not attending school (minimum of 15 consecutive school days) and during the summer of 1998 and recommends that the City Council amend the current year budget and authorize the City Manager to execute various agreements and contracts relative to the 1998 program for the period December 1, 1997 through September 30, 1998.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION**

The Summer Food Service Program has been administered by the Office of Human Services for a number of years for both the City and County of Sacramento. The purpose of the Summer Food Service Program is to provide nutritious lunches and snacks to youth, 18 years and under, who receive free or reduced cost meals at school during the school year.

In October of 1997 a request for proposal was sent to all of the school districts in the County of Sacramento to provide the meals and delivery for the 1997/98 Summer Food Service Program. Three proposals were received. A tasting group comprised of children of different ages and cultural background, parents and site supervisors rated the meals. The quality of the meals provided by the three bidders was very high and quite comparable.

Based on the high quality of the meals provided by all three bidders and the need to keep costs low by minimizing transportation costs and the desire to keep jobs in the neighborhoods, it is recommended that the City contract with all three bidders to provide meals. Del Paso Heights School District will provide meals to sites within their school district boundaries, Elverta School District will provide meals to all other sites north of the American River and west of business 80 and Elk Grove Unified School District will provide meals to all remaining sites.

**FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

The program is administered by the California State Department of Education and funded on a direct reimbursement basis by the United States Department of Agriculture with the City and County sharing the cost of program administration and supervision beyond the amount reimbursed. The total cost of the program in 1997 was \$724,943 all of which was reimbursed with no direct support required from the City and the County. The recommended budget amendment for 1998 is \$727,700 all to be reimbursed by the U.S.D.A. through the State Department of Education.


**POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**



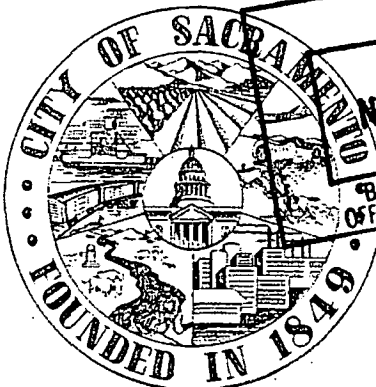
