**SUBJECT: GANG RESISTANCE EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM
APPLICATION**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT: City-wide.

RECOMMENDATION:

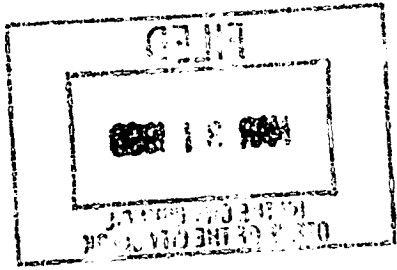
This is a report regarding the Police Department's submittal of the Gang Resistance Education and Training (G.R.E.A.T.) Program grant through the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF). Due to a short deadline from ATF, this staff report is presented to City Council after grant submittal. No action is requested at this time.

SUMMARY:

The Police Department applied for a two-year grant through ATF to work in partnership with Sacramento area school districts. G.R.E.A.T. consists of classroom instruction to junior high school students from uniformed police officers on alternatives to gang violence. This will be accomplished by police officers teaching a comprehensive nine-week course to seventh and eighth grade students.

Gang Resistance Education & Training Grant Application
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Approximately 3,400 "at-risk" students in eight junior highs and middle schools will be targeted for participation in the G.R.E.A.T. program. Four police officers will be selected to present this program and will work overtime hours to avoid any conflicts with patrol staffing. These officers will receive training as instructors for the 98-99 and 99-00 academic school years. Superintendents from the participating school districts have signed the grant application.

BACKGROUND:

G.R.E.A.T. began in the Phoenix metropolitan area in 1991, and has since been presented in 1,100 communities nationwide. A study from the National Institute of Justice (November 1997) reported that the program is having a positive effect on student attitudes and behaviors and is deterring them from involvement in gangs.

The National Institute of Justice compared students who participated in the program with those who did not. The comparison showed that the students who completed G.R.E.A.T. reported lower levels of gang affiliation and delinquency. One year following participation in the program, the survey showed that participants acquired positive attitudes toward police, negative attitudes toward gangs, and had more friends involved in prosocial activities. These results support the idea that trained law enforcement personnel can serve as prevention agents as well as enforcers of the law.

Locally, 574 violent crimes were committed by juveniles in 1997. Based on data from various sources, Sacramento has a youth violence problem that can be addressed between a partnership with law enforcement and city schools.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

This activity does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), CEQA Guidelines Sections 15061 and 15378.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Police Department has requested \$228,440 in grant funds which would cover officer pay, training materials and one vehicle. This is a competitive bidding process nationwide for approximately \$2 million in uncommitted funds. Under this grant, the Police Department would be required to cover only transportation/airfare costs for four officers to attend training in Phoenix prior to the 98-99 and 99-00 school years, estimated at \$1,408. The nine week classroom instruction would be completed primarily during overtime hours so that officers' regular duties are not impacted. No increase in FTE will occur.

The Police Department's application for grant funding for the G.R.E.A.T. grant is consistent with past practices. Due to a short turnaround, this grant request was submitted without City Council approval. If the grant is awarded, SPD will return to City Council to request grant acceptance authorization.



SUBJECT: CONTRACT PROGRAMMER SERVICES - APPROVAL OF CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$37,160 WITH DAPRU, INC., BRINGING VENDOR'S TOTAL COMPENSATION TO \$136,760

SUMMARY:

This report recommends that the City Council approve a Consultant Services Agreement in the amount of \$37,160 with DAPRU, Inc. for contract programmer services. Three previous agreements with this vendor for closely related services total \$99,600. The latest agreement for \$37,160 brings the total for the four agreements to \$136,700.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Extensive modifications and upgrades are required to each of the city's mainframe computer systems so that they will correctly process dates in 1999, 2000, and beyond (the "Year 2000 Project"). It is critical that Year 2000 Project work be completed well in advance of the date the systems will begin to fail.
- The contract programming services under this agreement will assist the Systems and Programming Division in several phases of its Year 2000 Project.
- Due to staff workload, and the complexity of the project, Administrative Services recommends that additional programming services be provided by Dapru.
- The City solicited proposals from qualified firms to supply Year 2000 services. Five firms submitted proposals. Three of these firms have been awarded contracts to provide programming services, including Dapru.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

There are several vacant programmer positions in the Systems and Programming Division. Sufficient salary savings exist in the division budget to award this contract.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

Ongoing administrative and maintenance activities, which are not made for purposes of a public works construction project, do not constitute a "project" and are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). CEQA Guidelines, Sections 15061(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

The requested action is consistent with existing policy concerning consultant services and Title 59 of the Sacramento City Code.
