Members in Session:

The City Of Sacramento has been experiencing tremendous growth in area the past few years. Presently many areas are in hands of developers who have started and completed many large home and business projects. The area we are particularly interested in at this time is the Riverside Pocket Area. The development of this area has been tremendous in the last couple of years and the immediate future will even be greater.

It now becomes necessary for us to put into effect one phase of the Fire Protection Service Plan that was adopted and approved by the City Council in June, 1961. This phase calls for the construction of a new fire house in the vicinity of 43rd Avenue and Gloria Drive. This new fire station will serve many purposes. It will provide much better service to the people now residing in the area and will give proper coverage to the homes that are now being constructed or will be in the near future. In addition this new station will replace our fire station at 6131 Riverside Blvd. The Riverside Blvd station is obsolete and inadequate to house the necessary manpower and equipment to give this high valued area proper Fire Protection.

We urgently request your approval for zoning this parcel of property to permit the construction of a fire station.
