APRIL 18, 1963

1. That the City make available a site in Del Paso Park near Watt Avenue and the Freeway, and that title be conveyed to the Children's Receiving Home with reversionary provisions to the City in event the Home is not operated satisfactorily, or ceases to operate as the Children's Receiving Home.
