PROPOSAL: The applicant is proposing to remodel the existing Donner School to house a variety of Police Athletic League activities and associated uses.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: The subject site contains the existing Donner Elementary School. The site was vacated for school purposes because it does not meet Title 21 requirements which specify certain earthquake standards for buildings occupied by publicly mandated Kindergarten through Twelfth grade students.

The Sacramento Police Athletic League has entered into a lease agreement to utilize the subject site for athletic facilities for youth, locker rooms, community meeting rooms, offices for P.A.L. and also leaseable office space (see attached Exhibit A).

STAFF EVALUATION: Staff has no objection to using the subject site as proposed by the Police Athletic League. Staff does want to ensure that the types of activities conducted on the grounds are community oriented and will not create a nuisance to the surrounding residences.

To insure that these uses are community oriented, staff recommends that each use, other than the Police Athletic League, be subject to staff review and approval.

This approach has been utilized to review and control the activities at the Sierra School site which also operates under a special permit as a social center.

The applicant has indicated that the rehabilitation of the site will include the development of a 43-space on-site parking lot. The 43 spaces appear to be adequate for the proposed use. Also, approximately 46 on-street parking spaces are available for overflow parking.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the following actions:

- 1. Ratification of the Negative Declaration;
- 2. Approval of the Special Permit, subject to conditions and based upon Findings of Fact which follow.

Conditions - Special Permit

- a. All uses other than the Police Athletic League shall be subject to review and approval of the Director of Planning prior to occupancy. The Director may require Commission review if he determines the use may adversely impact the adjacent neighborhood;
- b. All uses shall be community oriented;
- c. The uses shall not constitute a nuisance to the adjacent residential neighborhood;
- d. The open space shall be retained and maintained;
- e. All buildings shall meet the requirements of the Building Division.

<u>Findings of Fact - Special Permit</u>

- a. The project, as conditioned, is based upon sound principles of land use in that the proposed use is compatible with the surrounding residential and commercial uses;
- b. The project, as conditioned, will not be injurious to surrounding properties in that the proposal will not alter the characteristics of the site;
- c. The proposal, as conditioned, is consistent with the Oak Park Community Plan which designates the site for school use.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

A. The Sacramento Police Athletic League (P.A.L.) proposes to remodel the existing school building to house P.A.L. uses. The uses will be athletic facilities for youth, locker rooms, community meeting room, offices for P.A.L., leaseable office space upstairs, and athletic fields. Phase II of this work will be the construction of a gymnasium for basketball and boxing.

They currently have no home for their community service organization which through volunteer effort provides recreational opportunities for the youth of the community.
