Mr. Robert U. Grant, 1331 - 47th Avenue, appeared and asked the Council to extend 43rd Avenue to Freeport Boulevard.

Following continued discussion of the report, the City Traffic Engineer was instructed to supply copies of said report to the Southgate Shopping Center Merchants Association and the report was thereupon ordered filed, by the City Council.

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In accordance with report of the Chief of Police and recommendation of the City Manager, Councilman Mering moved that application of Mr. Eugene J. Morris and Mr. Clifton J. Stovall to conduct dancing at premises located at 2963 - 35th Street (New Mo Mo Club), be granted. Seconded by Councilman Talkin and carried by the following vote:
