SUBJECT: Resolution to Prohibit Parking on a Section of Tangerine Avenue

SUMMARY

Removal of parking on the east and west sides of Tangerine Avenue between Mack Road and Elder Creek is being recommended.

BACKGROUND

Tangerine Avenue between Mack Road and Elder Creek is 46 feet wide from curb to curb. Removal of parking is required to improve visibility and to allow for the installation of bike lanes. The impact is minimal, as very little on street parking occurs now. Raley's to the west has adequate parking on site. On the east is an apartment complex that is under construction. There are no residents to be notified.
