**SUBJECT ACCEPTANCE OF THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE "REGIONAL
COMMUNITY POLICING INSTITUTE" THIRD YEAR GRANT AWARD**

SUMMARY

The Sacramento Police Department has been awarded \$750,000 in third-year federal grant funds by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) under the Regional Community Policing Institutes (RCPI) program. The grant period is for one year. There is no City match required for this grant award.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION

There was none required for this report.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In August of 1997, the Sacramento Police Department was awarded a \$1,000,000 grant by the COPS Office to establish the Regional Community Policing Institute of Sacramento. RCPI - Sacramento was formally established in October 1997. In its second year, RCPI received \$750,000 in continuation funding. Currently RCPI is staffed by the following police department personnel: Police Captain (.5 FTE), one (1) Police Sergeant, one (1) Police Officer, two (2) Administrative Analysts, and one (1) Police Clerk.

The principle mission of RCPI - Sacramento is to "enhance implementation of the community policing philosophy throughout the region by providing quality community policing training and an accessible resource clearinghouse to law enforcement, community members and local government agencies" in a 48-county region from approximately Monterey County north to the Oregon border. In two years, RCPI has held a total of 13 workshops in basic community oriented policing, neighborhood revitalization, and community policing for police supervisors and dispatchers. In all, over 900 people have been trained at workshops. Special community events sponsored by RCPI include the Community Partnership for Safety Forum, Youth Forum and Domestic Violence Symposium with over 700 people in total attendance. All civilian employees of the Sacramento Police Department have also trained in community oriented policing by RCPI.

Partners

Principal partners of RCPI - Sacramento include: the California Attorney General's Office; the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.); and the Sacramento County Alliance of Neighborhoods (S.C.A.N.). RCPI - Sacramento continues to work closely with the San Diego and Los Angeles RCPI's. A Local Coordination Council consisting of community members and organizations meets quarterly to oversee and make recommendations on RCPI's activities.

Proposed Use of Funds

As required, RCPI - Sacramento will continue its training activities (workshops, forums and technical assistance) in the third year with the addition of workshops designed for remote and rural communities that have not yet utilized this training.

The long-term goal of the COPS Office and the Sacramento Police Department is for the Regional Community Policing Institute to be "institutionalized" into the department so that standardized and

state-of-the-art training in community oriented policing can be continued.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The total RCPI program cost is \$750, 000. The grant period will be for one year. There is a possibility of future funding. No City match is required.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

This proposal does not constitute a "project" and is therefore exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, Sections 1506(b)(1), 15378(b)(3).


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

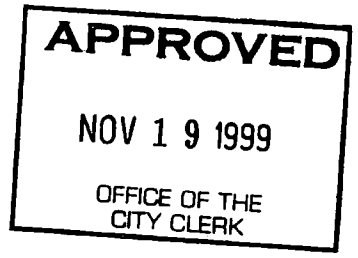

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT A \$750,000 GRANT AWARD FROM THE FEDERAL "REGIONAL COMMUNITY POLICING INSTITUTE" PROGRAM FOR THIRD YEAR FUNDING

WHEREAS the City of Sacramento desires to continue the Regional Community Policing Institute - Sacramento project to be funded from funds made available through the U.S. Department of Justice Office of Community Oriented Policing Services Regional Community Policing Institutes program.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that:

1. The City Manager, or a designated representative is hereby authorized to execute a grant award on behalf of the City of Sacramento, from the Office of Community Oriented Policing Services in the amount of \$750,000 including any extensions or amendments thereof, to implement the Regional Community Policing Institute - Sacramento.
2. The Grant Operating Budget will be increased by a total of \$750,000 as follows:
