REGULAR MEETING
SACRAMENTO CITY COUNCIL
JANUARY 6, 1950

The Honorable City Council met in Regular Session on this date at hour of 8:00 o'clock P. M. Mayor Coolegge presiding and roll call was answered as follows: Councilmen Bahnfleth, Coolegge, Geisreiter, Hendren, Macaulay, Nielsen, Sayre, Seymour, Wood.

The City Clerk reported having furnished each member a copy of proceedings of previous meeting. The minutes of meeting of December 30, 1949, were thereupon approved.

Relinquishing the Chair to Councilman Hendren, Mayor Coolegge, at this time, placed in nomination the name of Bert E. Geisreiter as Chairman of the Council. Councilman Macaulay seconded the motion and roll call resulted as follows:

Having been unanimously elected as Chairman of the City Council and in response to speech of welcome by Miss Coolegge, Mayor Geisreiter thereupon assumed the Chair and addressed the Council as follows:

"If there are words by which I can make known to you the sincere gratitude I feel to the people of Sacramento and the members of this council for this honor, these words seem, at the moment, to be held back as if to keep warm within the glow of the very feelings I am seeking to convey to you.

"Perhaps, in the days to come, I can more completely and more adequately express that gratitude through reality of purpose and action.

"When searching to express our inner feelings and ideas, it is natural to think in terms of our own experience and mode of life. Life, to me, is largely concerned with growing and producing things. This brings the constant observation of the miracle of the sprouting seen and the fascinating cycle from the seed, to the plant, to the blossom, to the fruit, and return to the seed again.

"This presents convincing evidence that the good always is there, ready to manifest itself and to reproduce itself if only we give it the opportunity.

"From my observations, city government is no hothouse plant to be cultivated under the glass tops of official desks. Nor will it thrive in a pot in a darkened Council chamber between meetings.

"The roots of city government run deep. They are deep down where the people live. The branches need the constant sunlight of public scrutiny and public approval.

"Unless we can make out service to this city government bear fruit, the honors and the titles which we accept in our official capacities will be like faded tinsel and the policies we adopt will become as withered and as useless and as unwanted as a Christmas tree the day after New Years.

"It is not written in the City Charter that any particular councilman be decorated with the title of mayor. Since custom confers this honor upon a council member simply by reason of the number of votes he receives, then custom also should require some measure of his worth in terms of the care and attention he gives to planning and planting and cultivating and pruning for better growth of the city which has so honored him.

"In the coming two years I hope to be judged not by what I may seem to have done to perpetuate myself in this position, but rather by what I have accomplished in helping other members of this Council to translate into reality the desires and the hopes of the people of Sacramento for the progress of their city along very definite lines. I hope to be able to interpret these desires and to suggest means of accomplishment.

"Custom requires that the mayor represent the city government in civic and community events and in the role of official host. But custom also should add the duty of tending the roots of government.

"These roots are spread among those people whose lives are not necessarily concerned with the social graces of formal functions nor with visiting dignitaries nor with pomp and parades, but who look to their city government for strong branches of service in providing opportunities for a fuller, cleaner, healthier, safer and more wholesome life. Into this group falls the vast majority of the people of Sacramento.

"In the scale of elected public officialdom, a City Council is at the bottom of the list. Yet, by the same token, it is the closest to the soil from which all government springs. City government is the first, the last and the only unit that daily and directly touches the life of the individual from the time he turns on the water faucet in the morning until the police patrol car passes his home at night.

"As the Policy-making body of the city government, this council has a duty and a function more vitally necessary than its lowly title in roster of officialdom indicates. The seemingly minor decisions this council is called upon to make have a greater significance in the lives of the people than most of the widely publicized acts of the State Legislature and the Congress.

"Representatives and bureaus of the higher units of government are beyond the immediate reach of the average citizen. The process of response to his wishes through these higher channels is slow and remote and slow of movement.

"Weeds of disinterest and discontent grow from the little seeds of small injustices and minor neglects. The better we can tend the soil for government at its roots, the better it will grow at the top.

"Thus, it is for us, here in this council, to keep this city government close to the people; to have its roots growing firmly and vigorously in the soil of co-operation and to have its branches strong and sound and balanced and protective, even for the least of those who seeks its shelter.

"To this cause I firmly and sincerely pledge all that I have to give."
