Title: Interagency Agreement: Fiber Optic Network Lease Agreement

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution**, approving and authorizing the City Manager or his designee to execute an Interagency Agreement with the Sacramento Public Library Authority for the lease of fiber on the City's fiber optic network.

Description/Analysis

Issue: The City of Sacramento currently maintains a fiber network throughout Sacramento. This proposed interagency agreement will allow the Sacramento Public Library Authority (Authority) to use approximately 142,764 lineal feet of the City's existing fiber conduit to connect to the Natomas Library. The Authority will be charged an annual maintenance and lease rate of \$0.05 per lineal foot, or approximately \$7,138.20 per year.

In addition, the Authority will fund a one-time construction cost of approximately 1000 feet of single-mode fiber (SMF) to connect the Authority's district offices' and main campuses' property lines to the City's fiber optic network system demarcations. The one-time construction cost is approximately \$4,640.

Policy Considerations: The interagency agreement provides for an initial term of ten years with an option to extend the agreement for three consecutive 5-year terms. As part of the agreement, the City and Authority will also mutually indemnify each other in case of negligent, intentional acts, or omissions cause by either party. Although there is no upfront cost to the City for entering into this agreement, staff is requesting Council authorization to proceed with the agreement.

Environmental Considerations: Approval of the interagency agreement is exempt under Section 15301 of the CEQA Guidelines which exempts the permitting, leasing, licensing or minor alteration of existing public or private structures or facilities. The City's existing fiber conduit has the capacity to house Authority fiber strands.

Rational for Recommendation: Authority desires to lease available fibers from the City's fiber optic network to connect their district offices and main campus to the Natomas Library.

Financial Considerations:

There is no financial obligation to the City with this agreement. Authority will fund all annual lease/maintenance and one-time construction costs.

AGREEMENT FOR FIBER OPTIC NETWORK LEASE

BACKGROUND
