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In order for the Council to secure their priority in the Clerk's selection of arguments, in the event the Clerk receives more than one argument in the same opinion as the Council, the Council must, before preparation of any argument, designate by resolution which member(s), up to five, will be authorized to co-author and sign the ballot argument.

If, when arguments are filed, the Clerk receives more than one argument in the same opinion as the Council, the Council's argument will have first priority rights of selection.

There are no financial considerations associated with this item.


