

RESOLUTION No. 20

Adopted by The Sacramento City Council on date of

WHEREAS, the State Agricultural Society has been considering the problem of providing additional fire protection for the State Fair Grounds, and as a part of such study has had a report prepared by the State Fire Marshal embodying certain recommendations for the better protection of the vast investment by the State of California in buildings and equipment; and

WHEREAS, it is the understanding of the City of Sacramento that one of the recommendations of the State Fire Marshal is that a modern pumping engine be purchased by the State Agricultural Society to be stationed at the fire house adjacent to the State Fair Grounds on the south, thus enabling the City of Sacramento to provide the necessary man power to operate such pumping engine at no expense to the State Agricultural Society; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Sacramento has always believed in the closest kind of friendly co-operation between the City and the State of California,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Sacramento that the man power and facilities of the City's Fire Department are available to the State of California at all times, and that if the State Agricultural Society adopts the recommendation of the State Fire Marshal relative to providing another pumping engine, such action will be deeply appreciated by the City of Sacramento, and such equipment will be used as an integral part of the facilities of the Sacramento Fire Department for the added protection of the State Fair property and the area in which such property is located.
