Title: Agreement: Additional Grant Funding for Lower American River Salmonid

Spawning Gravel Augmentation (G14000200)

Location/Council District: Citywide

Recommendation: Adopt a **Resolution** (1) ratifying the City Manager's approval, effective September 27, 2010, of an Assistance Agreement with the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) to provide additional federal funding in the amount of \$430,000, for the City-County Office of Metropolitan Water Planning (CCOMWP) to augment gravel in spawning riffles in the lower American River and provide additional spawning areas that will protect, restore, and enhance fish habitat; and (2) increasing the Habitat Management Element funding (Fund 7104) revenue and expenditure budgets for G14000200 for the grant funding in the amount of \$430,000.

Description/Analysis

Issue: In October 2006 the City, on behalf of the CCOMWP, entered into a grant funding agreement with Reclamation, for grant funding of up to \$600,000 for the Lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project (G14000200), to be completed by September 30, 2011. The purpose of the Project is to increase the availability of spawning gravel and rearing habitat for fall-run Chinook salmon and steelhead trout in the lower American River.

In August 2009, the City Council authorized the acceptance of an additional \$151,000 of grant funding from Reclamation. In August 2010, the City Council authorized the acceptance of additional funding for the Project from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and from the County of Sacramento Department of Transportation (DOT).

This report requests that City Council ratify the City Manager's approval of a second modification to the Reclamation funding agreement to accept additional funding for the Project in the amount of \$430,000. Ordinarily, Council approval would be obtained prior to the City's execution of an agreement modification to obtain such additional funding. However, CCOMWP staff did not receive the funding agreement modification from Reclamation until the week preceding the close of the federal fiscal year (September 30), and staff was notified by Reclamation that unless the agreement was signed prior to September 30, funding for the Project would be lost. The agreement was signed on behalf of the City Manager by an Assistant City Manager on September 27, 2010, and was signed by Reclamation the following day.

Policy Considerations: This Project will aid fish habitat restoration efforts for the Lower American River, consistent with the goals of the Water Forum Agreement and the Water Forum Successor Effort administered by the CCOMWP. Pursuant to the Interagency Agreement that created the CCOMWP, the City's procedures are followed for all CCOMWP contracting activities.

Environmental Considerations:

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA):

The Project is subject to review pursuant to both CEQA and NEPA. The Project work is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15333, Small Restoration Projects, as the Project does not exceed five acres in size, will be undertaken for the purpose of restoring habitat for fish, would have no significant impact on endangered, rare or threatened species or their habitat, and would not otherwise result in any significant effects on the environment.

Reclamation conducted the NEPA review and prepared a Finding of No Significant Impact. After consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), Reclamation included interpretive measures in the Project to mitigate any significant effects on historic resources, pursuant to a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between Reclamation, Sacramento County Parks and SHPO. In August 2010, the City Council authorized CCOMWP to sign the MOA as a concurring party.

Sustainability Considerations: Approval of the recommended actions is consistent with the City of Sacramento's Sustainability Master Plan Goals:

<u>Sustainability Goal No. 7</u> - Parks, Open Space and Habitat Conservation is promoted by the second co-equal objective of the Water Forum Agreement "To preserve the fishery, wildlife, recreational, and aesthetic values of the lower American River."

Commission/Committee Action: None

Rationale for Recommendation: It is recommended that the City Council ratify the City Manager's approval of the funding agreement modification, to provide \$430,000 in additional funding for the Project. Replenishing gravel in the lower American River will improve spawning and rearing habitat for anadromous fish, consistent with the Water Forum Agreement objective to preserve the fishery, wildlife, recreational, and aesthetic values of the lower American River.

Financial Considerations: This Project has no impact on the City of Sacramento's General Fund and no match is required. To date the Bureau of Reclamation has obligated \$751,000. The County of Sacramento DOT has contributed \$100,000 to this Project in order to satisfy mitigation requirements associated with the County's Watt Avenue Bridge Widening Project as required by the California Department of Fish and Game, and the USFWS has contributed \$148,695. Increasing the Habitat Management Element funding (Fund 7104) revenue and expenditure budgets for G14000200 for the grant funding in the amount of \$430,000 brings the total project budget to \$1,429,695.

Background Information:

The United States Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) operates facilities that regulate flows in the lower American River, which contains populations of anadromous Chinook salmon and threatened steelhead trout. Flow regulation and stream channel manipulations have modified anadromous salmonid habitat in the American River. Specifically, gravel is regularly lost from spawning sites on the river because of the construction and operation of Central Valley Project dams, bank protection projects, and other actions that reduce the availability of spawning gravel and rearing habitat in the American River downstream of Nimbus Dam.

In October 2006 the City of Sacramento entered into a grant funding agreement with Reclamation, on behalf of the CCOMWP, for grant funding of up to \$600,000 (C2006-1211) for the lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project (Project), expected to be completed by September 30, 2011. The purpose of the Project is to increase the availability of spawning gravel and rearing habitat for fall-run Chinook salmon and steelhead trout in the lower American River. The Project is consistent with the goals of the Fisheries and Instream Habitat Plan, which is incorporated into the River Corridor Management Plan (RCMP). The RCMP is a coordinated approach to management of the lower American River that was developed and endorsed by 38 organizations and local governments in 2002, including the City of Sacramento. Further, the project is a key project under the Habitat Management Element (HME) of the Water Forum Agreement, of which the City of Sacramento is a signatory. The HME implements one of the Water Forum Agreement's co-equal objectives, which is to preserve the fishery, wildlife, recreational and aesthetic values of the lower American River.

In August 2009, the City Council authorized the acceptance of an additional \$151,000 (C2006-1211-1) in grant funding from Reclamation for the Project. In August 2010 City Council authorized the acceptance of additional project funding of \$148,695.28 (C2010-0694) from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and \$100,000 (C2010-0719) from the County of Sacramento Department of Transportation.

This report requests that City Council ratify the City Manager's approval of a second modification to the Reclamation funding agreement to accept additional funding for the Project in the amount of \$430,000. Ordinarily, Council approval would be obtained prior to the City's execution of an agreement modification to obtain such additional funding. However, CCOMWP staff did not receive the funding agreement modification from Reclamation until the week preceding the close of the federal fiscal year (September 30), and staff was notified by Reclamation that unless the agreement was signed prior to September 30, funding for the Project would be lost. The agreement was signed on behalf of the City Manager by an Assistant City Manager on September 27, 2010, and was signed by Reclamation the following day.

Agreement: Lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation 10/26/2010

The additional \$430,000 in funding from Reclamation will be used for planning, permitting, placement of gravel, pre and post project site surveys, and the monitoring of spawning gravel and the response of salmonids in the lower American River in accordance with the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (CVPIA). The purpose of the CVPIA is to protect, restore, and enhance fish and wildlife habitat in the Central Valley Basin. Through this grant the CCOMWP will assist Reclamation in selecting the sites, obtaining appropriate permits, planning for and placing spawning gravel and monitoring the response of salmonids.

AGREEMENT FOR GRANT FUNDING FOR LOWER AMERICAN RIVER SALMONID SPAWNING GRAVEL AUGMENTATION (G14000200)

BACKGROUND

- A. In October 2006 the City entered into a grant funding agreement with the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation ("Reclamation"), to provide federal grant funding of up to \$600,000 for the City-County Office of Metropolitan Water Planning (CCOMWP) to undertake the Lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project (Project), to be completed by September 30, 2011. The purpose of the Project is to increase the availability of spawning gravel and rearing habitat for fall-run Chinook salmon and steelhead trout in the lower American River.
- B. In August 2009, the City Council authorized the acceptance of an additional \$151,000 of grant funding from Reclamation. In August 2010, the City Council authorized the acceptance of additional funding for the Project from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and from the County of Sacramento Department of Transportation.
- C. On September 27, 2010, the City Manager approved a second modification of the Reclamation funding agreement to accept additional funding for the Project in the amount of \$430,000. Reclamation required the City's approval prior to the close of the federal fiscal year on September 30.

BASED ON THE FACTS SET FORTH IN THE BACKGROUND, THE CITY COUNCIL RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Council ratifies the City Manager's approval, effective September 27, 2010, of an Assistance Agreement with the U.S. Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation to provide additional federal funding in the amount of \$430,000, for the City-County Office of Metropolitan Water Planning's Lower American River Salmonid Spawning Gravel Augmentation Project.
- Section 2. The City Manager or the City Manager's designee is authorized to increase the Habitat Management Element funding (Fund 7104) revenue and expenditure budgets for G14000200 by \$430,000.
