A RESOLUTION AWARDING ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT TREATMENT CAPACITY BANK
CONNECTION FEE CREDITS BY SACRAMENTO
REGIONAL COUNTY SANITATION DISTRICT (SRCSD)
FOR SUBWAY SANDWICHES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2001, City Council authorized the City Manager to sign a Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) to initiate City participation in the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District Economic Development Treatment Capacity Bank (CC2001-177);

WHEREAS, eighty five percent (85%), or 6,775 of the total 7,971ESD's (Equivalent Single-family Dwelling units) made available to the City of Sacramento under the MOU are allocated for economic development projects, the award of which must be approved by City Council resolution;

WHEREAS, Subway Sandwiches located at 8765 Center Parkway in Sacramento meets City economic development objectives by creating new employment.

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Sacramento, as follows:

- 1. City Council hereby awards a maximum of 1.98 ESD credits from the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District Economic Development Treatment Capacity Bank to Subway Sandwiches located at 8765 Center Parkway in Sacramento (APN: 117-0211-030).
- 2. Any and all credits awarded herein to each individual recipient shall expire if said individual recipient has not paid its requisite sewer impact fee to SRCSD within one-year from the date of approval of this resolution.
- Any and all credits awarded herein to each individual recipient will expire if said individual recipient has not been issued a building permit for its

respective above referenced development project within one year after the City Council has awarded use of the aforementioned sewer credits.

4. Award herein of 4.59 sewer credits will leave a total of 6,077.42 sewer credits for future award by the City to support economic development projects.
