**SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF TWO STATE HIGHWAY-RELATED TRANSPORTATION
ENHANCEMENT ACTIVITY (TEA) CANDIDATE PROJECTS.**

LOCATION AND COUNCIL DISTRICT:

Interstate 80 at Truxel Road, District 1.
State Highway 99 at Calvine Road/Cosumnes River Boulevard, District 8.

RECOMMENDATION:

This report recommends that the City Council approve a resolution authorizing staff to submit State Highway-related TEA project applications to Caltrans for funding consideration.

SUMMARY:

As part of the Federal Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA21), Caltrans receives funds for State Highway-related Transportation Enhancement Activity (TEA) projects. Staff is requesting Council approval to submit applications for a landscaping project at Interstate 80 and Truxel Road, and at State Route Highway 99 and Calvine/Cosumnes River Boulevard.

COMMITTEE/COMMISSION ACTION:

None.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Caltrans will receive approximately \$10 million annually for 6 years, for State Highway-related Transportation Enhancement Activity (TEA) projects. These TEA projects must have a direct relationship – by function, proximity or impact – to the State Highway System and must be over and above normal projects or mitigation requirements. The following types of activities are eligible:

- Bicycle or pedestrian safety programs and facilities;
- Acquisition of scenic or historic sites;
- Landscaping, preservation, rehabilitation, or operation of historic transportation facilities; and
- Control or removal of outdoor advertising.

Staff solicited project suggestions from Neighborhood Services, Planning, Downtown Development, SHRA, Parks, the City/County Bicycle Advisory Committee, and the Sacramento Area Bicycle Advocates. Several projects were suggested to staff that were found to be either ineligible, premature, or not fully scoped. Staff will evaluate these ideas to develop them into potential future applications. Staff is recommending the City submit the following two projects:

- Truxel Road/I-80 Interchange Landscaping.
- Cosumnes River Blvd./Calvine Road/SR99 Interchange Landscaping.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

If TEA funding is obtained, these will be a requirement for a 11.5% local funding match. Staff is recommending that Measure A Transportation Sales Tax be used for the matching funds.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

This funding strategy is not, in itself, a project. The subject of this report does not involve a project that requires compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), inasmuch as it does not involve an activity which may cause a direct or indirect change in the environment (Public Resources Code Section 21065). The projects will be subject to future environmental analysis.


POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:


