SUBJECT: REPORT AMERICAN RIVER PARKWAY PLAN.

Members in Session:

The American River Parkway Plan of the County Recreation and Park Department has been forwarded to the Commission by the City Council for study and report. The plan is a general plan for private and public development of the natural areas of the river, its banks and levees, from the Sacramento River to the County line.

Downstream from the American River Filtration Plant Site of the City, the American River area lies mainly within the City Limits. The area includes several publicly owned park areas, namely Discovery Park, State Fair Park, Glenn Hall Park, State College Park, Ancil Hoffman Park and Folsom State Park.

The purpose of the plan is to promote preservation of natural areas through purchase of land or easement rights and also to provide access area for public use to the river. The plan in no way conflicts with City plans. It is suggested the City study the possibility of aiding the objectives of the plan in those areas within the City where feasible.

The City should endorse the general objectives of the plan as stated above.

It is recommended the Commission urge the Council to do so.
