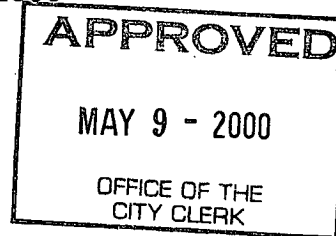

SUBJECT: RESOLUTION ANNEXING A PORTION OF 51ST STREET INTO THE U.C.D. MEDICAL CENTER RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING AREA.

SUMMARY:

This report recommends annexing a portion of 51st Street into the U.C.D. Medical Center residential permit parking area (Exhibit A). Regulating parking on this street will relieve the parking congestion generated by hospital employees and make it easier for residents to park near their homes.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

- Residents along a portion of 51st Street have requested annexation into the residential permit parking area.
- Parking will be limited to a maximum of one hour Monday through Friday from 8 am to 6 pm.
- Residents and their guests will be exempt from the parking restriction when the proper permit is displayed.
- A letter was sent to all residents that may be impacted by the permit parking regulation outlining the request and solicited comments.
- Residents favored the proposal.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The cost to implement the recommended parking regulation is estimated to be \$500 for the installation of regulatory signs. Funds are available in the On-street Parking & Animal Care Services operating budget.

ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The Neighborhoods, Planning and Development Services Department, Office of Environmental Affairs has reviewed the project and has determined that this project is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) under Section 15301(c) of the CEQA guidelines

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

This recommendation is consistent with the City Council priority of neighborhood revitalization and enhancement.

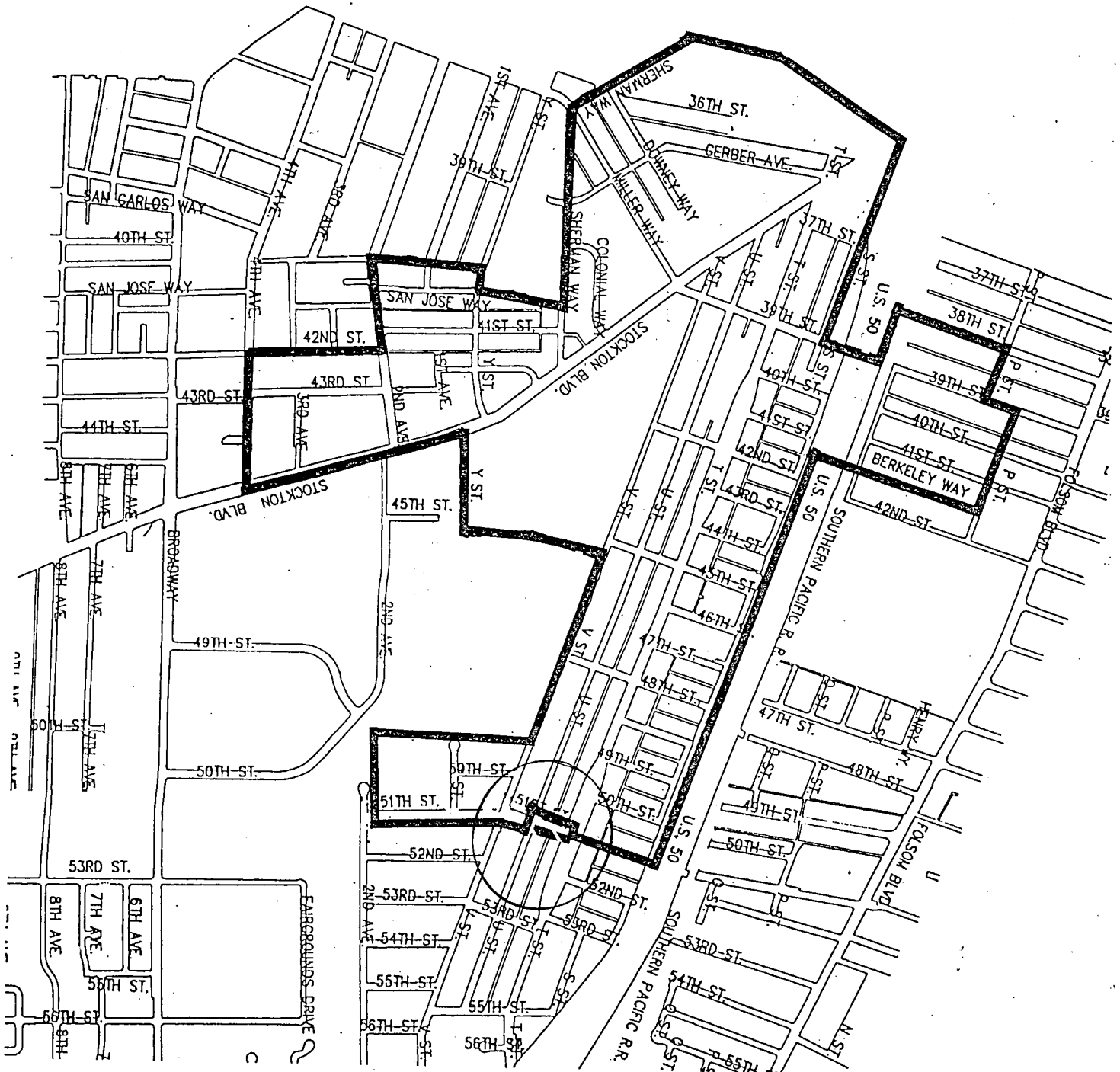

RESOLUTION ANNEXING A PORTION OF CERTAIN STREETS TO THE U.C.D. MEDICAL CENTER RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 25.10.186, of the Sacramento City Code, whenever the City Council finds that residential streets adjacent to a residential permit parking area have all day, on-street parking congestion, then upon recommendation of the Parking Manager, such residential streets may be added to said residential permit parking area.

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO THAT:

The following street shall be regulated with one-hour parking except with "B" permit from 8 am to 6 pm except Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays:

- 51st Street, both sides between T and U Streets.
