



1. Amendment to the Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District
Master Interagency Agreement

DISCUSSION: Mel Johnson, Director of Public Works, briefly summarized the staff report regarding the proposed amendments to the Sacramento County Regional Sanitation District (SCRSD) Master Interagency Agreement (MIA). Pat Gaffney of the Sacramento County Department of Public Works, Water Quality Division, discussed the proposed revisions to the SCRSD fee ordinance, designed to improve the equity between undeveloped properties inside and outside the district. The Committee discussed the impact that the proposed fee ordinance revisions would have on growth in certain areas. Mr. F.I. Hodgkin, Chief of the Water Quality Division of the Sacramento County Public Works Department, noted that, while fees for undeveloped property outside the district would decrease, fees for some undeveloped property already inside the district would increase. The net impact of the proposed changes on SCRSD fees would be positive over the next 20 years, Mr. Hodgkin said. Mr. Victor Scotti, also of the Water Quality Division of the Sacramento County Public Works Department, commented on non-sewered areas within developed areas of Sacramento County.
